## Social Studies

This week in Social Studies, students began chapter 4. This chapter focuses on life in the Virginia colony from the 1620's-1760's. We will finish up this chapter next week.

There will be a test over chapter 4 on Thursday, January 19.

### Math

In Math this week we took our Chapter 6 test on Division. The kids enjoyed learning various strategies for division, and mastering long division with the standard algorithm. We will continue to work on multi-step word problems that incorporate a variety of operations. Next week we will begin Chapter 7 on Patterns and Sequences.

## Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week in Language Arts, students presented their research project which focused on natural disasters! The students gave incredible presentations that demonstrated not only their new found knowledge of natural disasters, but also new writing skills that they have developed over the last 2 months.

We also began a mini poetry unit this week. Next week, we will continue this unit.

### Religion

In Religion we took our Unit 2 Lesson 9 quiz. We began Unit 2 Lesson 10- "How are we strengthened for service to God and others?" We reflected on the meaning of the Sacraments at the service of Communion- Matrimony and Holy orders. We reflected on ways we serve our family and shared great things we intend to do with our lives to better understand both of these vocations.

Our Unit 2 Lesson 10 quiz and the Unit 2 Religion test are scheduled for the week of January 23rd.

### Science

In Science this week we took our Chapter 6 test on energy transfer in ecosystems. We look forward to beginning Chapter 7 next week which will transition us from the Life Science portion of our curriculum to Earth science. We will be exploring the impact of the rock cycle on earth's ever-changing surface to topics like the water cycle, planets, and other objects in space.
