### Math

This week we worked on the basics of coordinate grids. We will be graphing coordinates this week.

\*Students will need to complete (mastery level) Khan Academy *Coordinate Plane, Line Plot and Multiply Decimals* by the end of the 3rd quarter.

\* Please practice the basic multiplication facts at home or in the car coming to and from school. Knowing your multiplication facts is a vital skill that students will be needing for success in math in school and in daily life.

# Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week we finished the four-paragraph essay related to *Wonder*. We also had a test on Greek and Latin roots affixes, and students received the list of Greek and Latin root words as our next set of spelling words. They will have a test on those roots on Thursday, January 19. We also learned a little about the author of *Love That Dog*, Sharon Creech this week.

Next week, we will start reading *Love That Dog*, so please be sure your child has a copy of the novel for Tuesday. Next week, we will also return to our study of sentence fragments and run-on sentences, and students will be ready for a test on this material early the week of January 23.

## Religion

This week we focused on the structure of the Bible, and students will be ready for a test on that material the week of January 23. We will be focusing primarily on the books of the Pentateuch. Students will also begin memorizing the Nicene Creed.

### Science

This week students learned about Earth's lithosphere and biosphere. Next week we will do a project that connects to how we can better care for our environment. Please save empty 2 liter bottles for this project. Please rinse the bottle prior to sending it to school. Thanks!
