Announcements:

Please know that we will be going outside even in the very cold winter months. Our girls can wear navy tights or capris to keep them warm outside. Of course, pants and polos are also a good option. Bare skin on frigid days is a concern. Please help us by helping your child on days they wear a jumper. Thank you!

Even though the weather is colder, we will continue to get the students outside for recess as often as possible. Please make sure your child has the outerwear needed so that they can participate in recess. Below are the guidelines we follow:

- Students should stay inside if the wind-chill factor is below 25°F.
- If the wind-chill is in the 30s, students should have a coat (not a sweatshirt) and it should be encouraged that their heads are covered (hat or cinched coat/sweatshirt hood).
- If the wind-chill is in the 40s, students should at least have a sweatshirt on.
- Students who do not have the proper outerwear will sit in the front office for recess.

Social Studies

This week we continued to learn about Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. We read our Scholastic News issue focused on Dr. King and started working on a trifold in which we will recall important details of his life.

Math

This week we continued working on place value. We introduced the vocabulary expanded form and standard form. We learned that the standard form is just having the number written the "regular way" and how the expanded form shows the value of each number. We also learned how to write numbers to 120 in word form.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Reading

This week we read *Chameleons are Cool*. We used this nonfiction book to help us discuss Main Idea and Supporting Details. We also discussed Nonfiction Text Features such as Captions, Index, Labels, Headings, Electronic Menu, and Table of Contents. Next week we will read *The Darkest Dark* by Chris Hadfield.

<u>Grammar</u>

This week we focused on Nonfiction Text Features and review previously taught skills (i.e., capitalization, punctuation, verb tenses, synonyms, and other conventions in our writing). Next week we will discuss suffix -ing.

Writing

This week our writing centered around Main Idea and Supporting Details. We practiced identifying the main idea from various texts and then compared that to supporting types of sentences. We also wrote descriptive sentences about what we learned from the nonfiction texts and topics (chameleons). Writing activities in our Daily 5 rotations such as journal/story writing and dictation of sentences continued as well.

Theology

In Theology, we continued our unit on the Sacraments, focusing on the meaning of each sacrament and putting them into their three categories: initiation, service, and healing. We, also, played a fun scrambled sacraments game where students matched sacramental symbols to their corresponding sacrament!

Science

This week we focused on social studies.

Please make sure that your child brings something warm and long sleeve to school each day (e.g., jacket, sweatshirt, sweater). We will continue to go outside, weather permitting, for recess, lunch, and snack as much as we can.
