Science

Social Studies

Total experts! Our cute connoisseurs will share their expertise about a variety of famous historical figures on Tuesday, January 30 from 2:15-3:00. From interviews in front of a "live studio audience" to slideshow presentations to life-size portraits of inspiring heroes, the Hawks are sure to wow you! Please join us in the Performance Space for an afternoon of lavish learning! Ask your radiant researcher which of the below projects he/she chose:

- Interview "The Talker" Students will showcase their flair for drama by writing and acting out a script in which their famous person is interviewed on a "TV Talk Show"
- Portrait "The Artist" Students will create a lifesize portrait of their famous person with handwritten facts and textural details (buttons, yarn, paint, fabric, etc.) with factual context (example: including a bus for Rosa Parks or a kite and key for Benjamin Franklin) to entice their viewers
- Google Slideshow "The Techie" Students will take on the role of "professor" to create a captivating Google slideshow full of facts about their famous person to present to their second grade classmates.

Math

Super Subtractors! The Hawks are tackling subtraction strategies for two-digit subtraction (decomposing, base-10 blocks, hundreds charts, number lines, algorithm, decomposing etc.), finding the one that is their "just right fit." Next week, we'll conclude this unit with a test.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Ready for take-off! Our fluency flocks are diligently working to improve intonation, raise reading rate, and emphasize expression as they read aloud. When reading at home, encourage your radiant reader to read like an actor!

Next week, our dramatic darlings will begin lovingly creating puppets in Art (we love collaborating with the fabulous Mrs. Devlin!) to complement a script writing project in our classroom. The Hawks will perform their puppet shows for both Junior Kindergarten classes in February! What an amazing opportunity to bring the art of reading and writing to life, and to be the "big kids!"
