Social Studies

In history we will be learning about early US history and how we came to be a nation.We will be learning about major events of the American Revolution.

We have been estimating fractions, working with mixed numbers, adding and subtracting like and unlike fractions, reducing fractions to their lowest terms and more. We will be starting our new unit on multiplying fractions (easy stuff) and reducing fractions to their simplest terms (harder stuff).

To reinforce math concepts and skills, students are assigned sections for Khan Academy (<u>khanacademy.org</u>). This is for a grade. Students have their login and password in their planner. The 3rd qtr. requirements, **due before the end of the quarter 3/19/24** are Coordinate Plane, Line Plots and Multiplying decimals (under 5th grade - **not** Getting Ready for 5th).

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This short week students took the MAP Reading assessment, worked on Greek and Latin affixes, and read a short story in the *Journeys* book. Students also reviewed the comments I made on their second quarter IRAs and made corrections for some of the errors identified in them. *Please review your child's IRA grades and comments (on Google Classroom), as we continue to see many of the same errors being made on different assignments. Most of the IRAs were very good, but there were a few that received very low grades that affected the language arts grade. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions about the grades and/or comments.*

Next week we will begin reading *Love That Dog* and will begin a unit on prepositions in grammar. That grammar unit tends to be challenging for students, so we will spend some time going over the material. Students will also have a quiz on Greek and Latin affixes on Tuesday.

Theology

This week students continued our study of prayer, and we began to prepare for Catholic Schools Week. Next week, we will continue focusing on prayer, and we will hold the class-level Catholic Bee.

Science

We have been focused on the biosphere, lithosphere, hydrosphere and atmosphere. We will be learning about conservation, recycling, reducing and reusing. We will talk about how humans interact with the earth and its positive and negative effects.
