6th: This week the 6th graders learned about the rise in immigration the United States during the late 1800s. Next week they will have their test on Post-Civil War America on Thursday.

7th: This week the 7th graders finished their World War 2 unit. Next week they will begin exploring the Cold War and post World War 2 America.

8th: This week the 8th graders learned about Ghengis Khan and the rise of the Mongols. Next week they will return to China to explore the Sui, Tang, Song, Yuan, and Ming Dynasties.

Math 6 (Garland): This past week, we started looking at Proportional Relationships. Next week, we will find missing values in proportions and then Quiz on Unit Rates/Proportions on Tuesday. After reviewing, I plan to test, dividing it amongst 2 days, on Thursday, the 26th, and Friday, the 27th on our Proportional Relationships Unit.

Pre-Algebra (Garland): This past week, we started our unit on Geometry, where we will take our equation solving skills and start applying them to diagrams. This coming week, our focus is directed around solving angles using relationships we will discover. I plan on assessing these new found skills on Thursday, the 26th for 8th grade and Friday the 27th for 7th and 6th grade.

Geometry (Garland): This past week, we started our new Unit, entitled, "Quadrilaterals". We looked at identifying/classifying 4 sided figures and proved properties associated with parallelograms. This coming week, we will get into properties associated with diagonals of Rectangles, Rhombuses, Squares, Kites, and Isosceles Trapezoids. By the end of the week, we will investigate and be able to problem solve with the midsegment properties of a trapezoid.

Math 7 (Reid): This past week we had MAP testing on Wednesday and Thursday. **A reminder that our 1st test of the 3rd quarter will be on Monday, January 23rd on Number Sense.** We went on to start our unit on Algebraic Expressions where we started to compile an Operations Word List that we will use to translate verbal expressions into algebraic expressions. After we translate expressions, we will look towards simplifying and evaluating expressions.

Algebra (Reid): This past week we started to learn how to write the equation of a line given a point & slope or 2 points. We will continue our work in finding equations of lines that are parallel as well as perpendicular to lines that are given. In the coming 2 weeks, we will complete a "Mountain Range" Project that will incorporate all of the different types of lines and incorporate this into an art project. I'm excited to see what the kids will create!

Composition, Literature, and Language

6th Grade Composition (Kerrigan): This week, we started back up with *Vocabulary Power Plus* and lesson 10. Next week, there is a pronouns test on Monday, and then we will be starting a unit on verbs. In English Composition class, homework is primarily graded upon timely completion. Late assignments only receive a 50% because we go over all of the answers in class on the day the assignment is due. Please make sure your students are not leaving their *Voyages* and *Vocabulary Power Plus* books at home. Thank you!

6th Grade Literature (Kerrigan): This week, we began our next novel, *Maniac Magee*, and to provide context for our book, we took a look at the history of segregation in our country. Students also visited the library to pick out IRA books. The first IRA of Quarter 3 is due on Tuesday, February 14.

7th Language Arts (Lowdon): The rough draft of a short story based loosely on the themes found in *The Pearl* is due Monday. I will be conferencing with each student on their writing before the final draft is due. We began reading a second novella by John Steinbeck, *The Red Pony*. Students will begin a new Wordly Wise lesson on Monday (lesson 4). The first IRA of Quarter 3 is due on Tuesday, February 14.

8th Language Arts (Lowdon): The rough draft of a short story based loosely on the themes/conflicts found in *Lord of the Flies* is due Monday. I will be conferencing with each student on their writing before the final draft is due. There will be a quiz on *Lord of the Flies* on Tuesday/Wednesday. We will be viewing the film adaptation of Thornton Wilder's play, *Our Town*. Viewing and discussing this film represents a rite of passage for 8th graders. Students will begin a new Wordly Wise lesson on Monday (lesson 4). The first IRA of Quarter 3 is due on Tuesday, February 14.

Middle school students will have their projects on display throughout the school and will describe their research to you and the judges.

6th: This week we discovered the difference between nonvascular and vascular plants. We identified characteristics of plants. We started to understand the process of photosynthesis and will continue this concept next week. Next week we will also dissect a flower.

7th: This week we learned how to balance chemical equations and identify different types of chemical reactions. Next week we will start physics.

8th: This week we learned about the properties of soil and how it is created. We discovered the difference between weathering and erosion. We experimented with soil textures and used microscopes to witness particle sizes of silt, sand and clay. Students learned how to identify soil textures. Next week we will start to discuss fossils and relative age in relation to geologic time.
