Curriculum

Math

This week we completed our unit on 2 and 3 Dimensional shapes and fractions. We discussed/reviewed key vocabulary such as equal shares, equal parts, halves, and fourths. This unit was all about laying the foundation for what fractions are, understanding how fractions are related to whole numbers and objects, and how to identify individual shares/parts. Next week we will begin our unit on Measurement and Time. We will start off by comparing and ordering Lengths, Heights, and Widths.

Reading and Language Arts

Reading

This week we read *Chameleons are Cool.* We used this nonfiction book to help us discuss Main Idea and Supporting Details. Prior to our Virtual Learning Day and recent snow, we had planned to also discuss Nonfiction Text Features such as Captions, Index, Labels, Headings, Electronic Menu, and Table of Contents. However, we have decided to push this into next week. We will continue using the same book as well as other Chameleon-related texts and resources to practice these skills. There will not be a new featured story next week. Additionally, We will continue to compare and contrast the writing styles and content found within various Fiction and Nonfiction texts as well as good overall reading strategies/habits.

Grammar

Rather than introduce a new grammar skill next week, we will instead focus on Nonfiction Text Features and review previously taught skills (i.e., capitalization, punctuation, verb tenses, synonyms, and other conventions in our writing).

Word Study/Spelling

We practiced sorting our words, reviewed closed syllables ("cat" - a short vowel followed by consonants) and open syllables ("go" - a syllable that ends in a vowel with a long sound), identified phonemes (individual sounds) and introduced Vowel Team syllables (2 letters/1 sound - CVVC spelling patterns - ai, ea, ee, ou, and the oddball oo). We also continued reviewing previously taught spelling patterns and skills. Next week students will receive a new word sort (spelling list).

Writing

This week our writing centered around Main Idea and Supporting Details. We practiced identifying the main idea from various texts and then compared that to supporting types of sentences. We also wrote descriptive sentences about what we learned from the nonfiction texts and topics (chameleons). Writing activities in our Daily 5 rotations such as journal/story writing and dictation of sentences continued as well.

Religion

This week we continued our study of Noah. We completed a story square in which we answered some who, what, why and how questions using the story of Noah. We also used a Venn Diagram to compare Noah's Ark to boats today. Next week we will continue exploring the story of Noah.

Science/Social Studies

This week we completed our unit on Plants. We discussed the different parts of a plant and their unique needs as well as photosynthesis and other plant functions and uses.

Homework

Math - 2nd Quarter Week 3 Math Sheet - Complete one activity each night (M - Th).

Reading - Read for 15 min./night. Please record the title of the book that was read each night. Additionally, for each completed book, your child will color in their reading log for the month (e.g. January books = Snowflakes). Don't forget the monthly reading challenge that was included in the binder as well. These activities are designed to motivate readers/encourage students to have fun with reading. It's optional, but highly recommended.

Word Study/Spelling - Students should sort their Word Study/Spelling words each night as well as work on 3 activities total of their choosing from the Weekly Spelling Menu (M - Th, 10 min./night).

Notes From the Classroom

<u>Virtual School Days - Thoughts</u>

If we have additional Virtual School Days, First Grade will continue to use the Google Meet Platform to have our meetings. To help these meetings run smoothly, there are a couple of things that are going to be important for students to keep in mind. We will of course be reiterating these rules/guidelines here at school.

- 1) **Noise** Please remind your child to remain "muted" until they have been prompted otherwise by their teacher. Students should "raise their hand," just as they would in the classroom, if they would like to share something (red hand icon).
- 2) **Appearance** Although uniforms will not be required for first graders, it is important that your child presents themself in a positive manner. Therefore, when they are on camera, they should be ideally sitting at a table/desk or in a chair. They should not be lying in their bed. They should also do their best to avoid anything that may distract the other students on screen (i.e., playing and/or excessive moving around).
- 3) **Typing** If students need to type or respond to their teacher, they can utilize the chat feature by clicking on the word bubble icon.

As a reminder, we may be doing this again because we have already missed 5 days of school and hope to not add make-up days to the end of our school year. We fully realize that this plan only works if the area does not lose power or internet. If we have virtual school and you cannot access, it will be an excused absence. We will continue to utilize the home materials (Snow Day Packet) as well. First grade will continue to be largely asynchronous, with digital check-ins available throughout the day.
