We are practicing short vowel word families. This week the emphasis was on short o. Next week's emphasis will be short u.

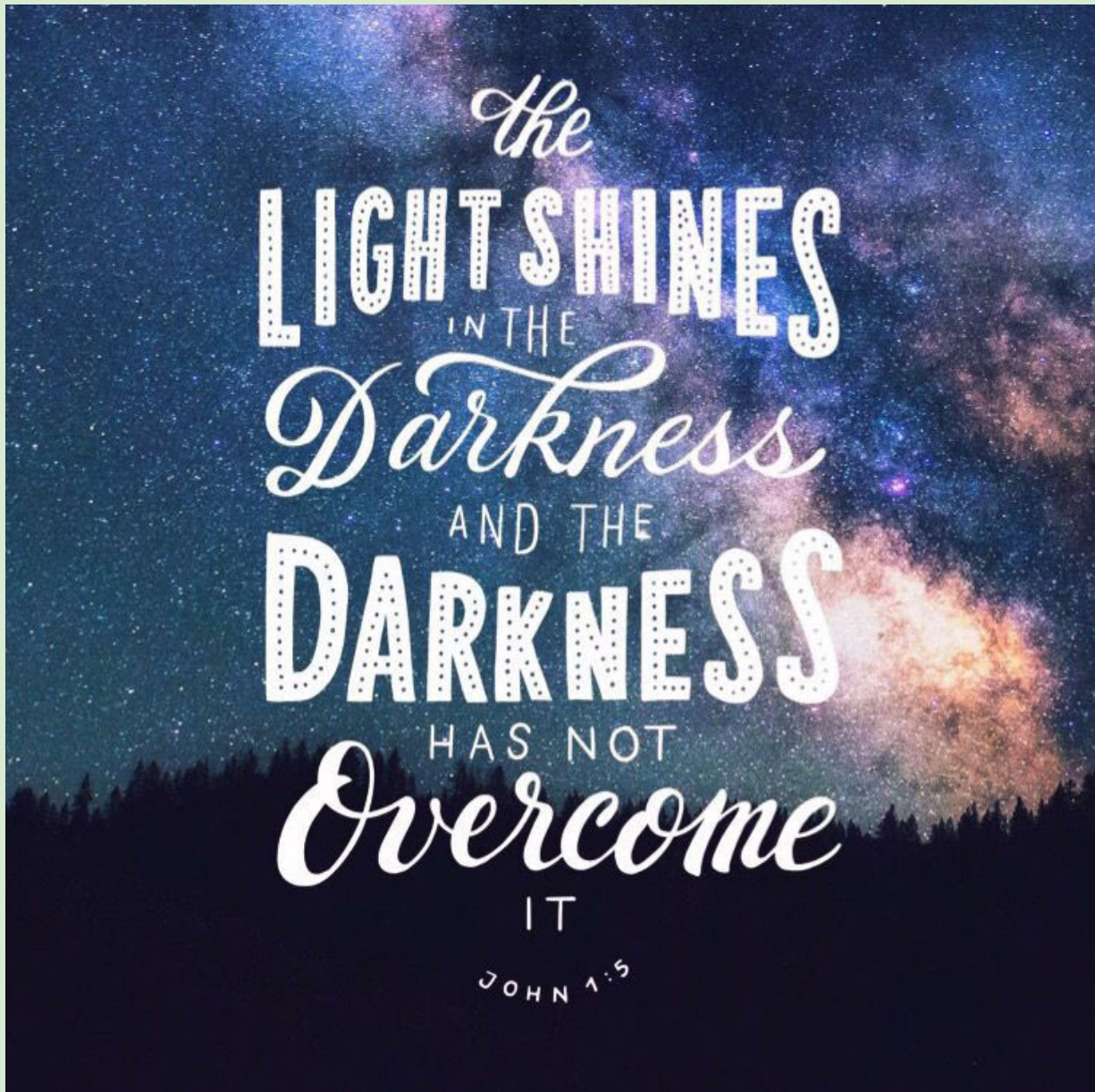
