Immunization and School Entrance Health Forms

Students enrolling in **Kindergarten** need to have a <u>Commonwealth of Virginia School Entrance Health form</u>. Physicals, including updated immunizations, must have been <u>on or after August 20th</u>, <u>2024</u>. Please <u>submit the entire document</u>. This form should not require an additional doctor's visit if they have been seen within this time frame. Many doctor's offices get busy over the summer with form requests, please ask for this as soon as possible. Your child **CAN NOT** attend school until these papers are provided and are reviewed by the school nurse. Feel free to start sending them in from now.

Math

Ms. Wawner's class started a unit on graphing. Students learned that a graph is a picture of data. We reviewed the steps on how to collect information and make a graph. We are also learning how to read graphs. We will continue with graphing next week. Ms. Shank's class worked on number sense with teen numbers. We also learned about symmetry using snowflakes to help us understand it.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Ms. Wawner's class learned about the letter Uu this week and its two distinct sounds. We started working on a new sight word, "like," and continued to read books by Ezra Jack Keats and the Artic. Next week, we will learn about the letter Bb and start talking about syllables. Ms. Shank's class continued working on our letter Mm and rhyming. Next week our letter will be Nn. We finished our penguins flap book with lots of information on penguins. Next week we will study the arctic and polar bears.

Theology/SEL

Ms. Wawner's class met another hero of The Bible, John the Baptist. Students enjoyed listening to and watching stories about John. Next week, we will be celebrating Catholic Schools week and will dip into vocations. Ms. Shank's class learned about Johan and the Whale.

Science and Social Studies

Ms. Wawner's class finished exploring the Arctic this week. We learned about the specific adaptations of Arctic animals, such as blubber, webbed feet, and strong senses of hearing and smell. We focused on polar bears, harp seals, and snowy owls. Next week, students will learn about and celebrate the Lunar New Year. Ms. Shank's class finished our study of penguins and will begin a study of the arctic and polar bears.
