Social Studies

Math

We discussed word problems and the strategies that we used to determine whether we need to add or subtract. We also continued to practice counting to 100! Some of them already know how to count to 100. At this time, the students are now expected to count to 75. The students have also been counting to 100 by 2s, 5s and 10s. We have calendar time during math every day. The students continue to learn our days of the week song, months of the year song and seasons every day.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

The students are continuing to practice reading to self and work on writing. Please have your child read the books and reading comprehension packets sent home every Friday to you three times to practice sight words and fluency. **Our sight words this week were: eat, who, new, must, black, white Our sight words for next week are: soon, our, ate, say, under.**

Theology

We read about the three people of the Holy Trinity who are: The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. We also talked about what qualities of a good friend are and what examples Jesus showed us to be a good friend. We are so excited to celebrate Catholic Schools Week next week! Monday, January 27th is Catholic Charities Dress Down Day. Please have your child/children bring in \$5 to participate. The money will go toward the California Wild Fires. Wednesday is Patriotic Day so JK-2 grades will wear red with uniform pants or jeans only.
