Important Nurse Announcements:

Rising 7th grade students must provide updated immunization forms showing that they have received a Tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis vaccine (Tdap) and the 1st Meningococcal (ManACWY) vaccine. HPV vaccine is recommended but not required by the Catholic Diocese of Richmond. Students **WILL NOT** be allowed to start school without the appropriate immunization records. Please start sending them in from now.

6th Grade US History: This week the 6th graders learned about the impact World War I had on people at home. Next week they will dive into the reasons America joined the war.

7th Grade US History: This week the 7th graders learned about the Berlin Airlift and discussed the trial of the Rosenbergs. Next week they will explore the 1950s civil rights movement.

8th Grade World History: This week the 8th grade learned about British history and the Norman Conquest. Next week they will return to China and learn about Tang Dynasty China.

Math 6 (Garland): This past week, students used proportions to help solve for pricing of items along with looking at a unit rate with a denominator of 1, to determine item cost. On Monday, students will be quizzed on Unit Rates. We will then use the remainder of the week to prepare and test on Proportional Relationships (test will be Thursday)

Pre-Algebra (Garland): Students were assigned a quiz on solving inequalities this past Friday. We will review for a unit Test on Equations and Inequalities on Monday and the students will test on Tuesday. On Wednesday, we will start our Geometry unit by focusing on Angle measurement and classification. Students will calculate measures of angles by evaluating expressions. Afterwards, they will have to correctly classify angles based upon their Algebraic results.

Geometry (Garland): This past week, we revisited triangle congruence proofs, focusing on right triangles. This coming week, we will wrap up our unit on "Right Triangles" by having students assess with a Take Home Test given on the Thursday, January 30th and due Friday, the 31st.

Math 7 (Reid): This past week we wrapped up our unit on Decimal Operations & Comparing Numbers in Different Forms. The kids tested on this on Friday. Next week, we will start to learn about the mathematical properties in our number system in preparation for starting to solve equations. If you could please check in with your child and ask them if they have enough pencils, pens and highlighters I would really appreciate it \bigcirc Many students are coming to class and saying that they don't have these materials and we use them every day in class. Algebra (Reid): This past week we wrapped up our unit on Writing Equations of Lines (parallel, perpendicular & line of best fit) & Functions. The kids tested on Friday. On their block day, we started our next unit on Systems of Linear Equations. We learned how to solve them by graphing and will learn to solve them by the substitution and elimination methods next week. Composition, Literature, and Language Arts -

6th Grade English Composition (Kerrigan): This past week, we continued our studies of pronouns with subject vs. object pronouns, possessive pronouns, and contractions. There is a **pronoun quiz on Monday**. We also completed Lesson 12 in vocabulary this week. The **lesson 10-12 test is next Friday**.

6th Grade Literature Vocabulary (Kerrigan): This week, students took their MAP reading tests on Wednesday and Thursday. We also studied some of the long-lasting implications of Jim Crow laws and historical redlining in preparation for reading our next novel, *Maniac Magee,* a story set in a racially-divided town.

7th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, we continued with our analysis of *Animal Farm* with more background research presentations and a written reflection on chapters 1-7. Students also took the MAP Reading test on Wednesday and Thursday. Next week, we will continue with *Animal Farm* and read Orwell's classic essay, "Shooting an Elephant." Please make sure your student fills in the IRA #5 Google form due this coming Tuesday the 28th.

Students should be reading for the next IRA, due **Tuesday, February 11th**.

8th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, we continued with our analysis of Part 1 of Hillenbrand's *Unbroken*. Students also took the MAP Reading test on Wednesday and Thursday. Next week, 8th graders will take an analysis quiz on Parts 1 and 2 of *Unbroken*. Please make sure your student fills in the IRA #5 Google form due this coming Tuesday the 28th.

6th Grade Life Science:

This week we discussed formats for slide and oral presentations. We also concluded the kingdom Plantae by investigating how leaves work and learning about seed dispersal. We also practiced writing Claims with Evidence and Reasoning. Next week we will finalize our science fair projects and transition into the Animal Kingdom.

7th Grade Physical Science:

This week we continued motion. We learned about the formulas or Speed, Velocity, and Acceleration. We started with Newton's first law of motion and started to learn about the influences of friction. Next week we will continue with the forces of flight.

8th Grade Earth Science:

This week we explored weathering and soil. We experimented with different soils to text their texture and observe their composition. Next week we will start to explore geologic time and investigate fossils.

Spanish 1 [Part 1–7th grade] (DeMaio): This week, seventh graders completed several grammar activities with personal pronouns and began conjugating regular -ar verbs. They also took a quiz this Friday on personal pronouns. Next week we begin the topic "Tu sala de clase=Your classroom" Grammar: The verb estar, plural of nouns and articles.

Spanish 1 [Part 2–8th grade](DeMaio): This week the 8th graders did several activities in their workbooks and the SAVVAS program. They work in a lot of grammar: Making comparisons learning when and how to use more than more than... menos que=less than... adjectives like bueno= good, malo=bad, adverbs bien=good and mal=bad and comparatives mejor que=better than, peor que=worse than, mejor que=greater than, menos que=less than, the Superlatives más=more and menos=less mejor que better than/=peor que=worse than. On Friday, they took a quiz to recognize the vocabulary in this topic. They started conjugating verbs poder y dormir=to be able and "to sleep. They had a pop quiz this Friday related to the vocabulary "En mi dormitorio". Next week starts the new topic: ¿Cómo es tu casa?=What is your house like? + vocabulary. Grammar: Affirmative tú commands, The present progressive tense.
