Social Studies

In Social Studies this week we have been learning about dental health in preparation for our guest speaker, Dr. Minutella next week. We read the Scholastic News on Tooth Talk, taking turns reading each sentence. Students have really enjoyed reading aloud!

Math

For Math, we finished up our unit on subtraction. We took a little break from our unit studies to solve a mystery, Math Mystery: The Case of the Bee Bandits! That caused quite the excitement in the classroom as some have finished, but are not allowed to share the answer! And we continued on to start our new unit study on 2D shapes.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

In Reading and Writing, we have been working on a Space unit. We read in class an autobiography children's book, The Darkest Dark about Chris Hadfield. We, then, read an informative book on Out of Space. The purpose of these two stories was to focus on the differences between a nonfictional, informative text and an autobiography. We are continuing to wrap up this unit while moving on to learning about inferences, schemas and what four types of sentences are. Our book for this unit is Cloudette. Ask your children about inferring, evidence and a polar bear on a treadmill! A fun conversation should ensue!!

Religion

In Religion, we are continuing to focus on the Fall and God's love that was shown in the passages regarding Noah's Ark.

Science

For Science, we have started our Space-Sun, Moon and Stars unit. This week we learned a lot of new vocabulary words and the names and line up of the planets (my very excited mother just served us nuggets is a prompt for the order of the planets we learned!)
