# Junior Kindergarten

### Math

Ms. Wawner's class completed our graphing unit this week, by graphing data about weather, insects, and class favorites. We mainly focused on pictographs and bar graphs. We began our study of positional words, such as over, under, beside, in front of, etc. and will continue to work on these next week. Ms. Shank's class will be reviewing some of our prior units, (patterns, counting, graphing, i.e.)

## Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Ms. Wawner's class focused on the letter U this week. We created Us and the other letters we have learned with pipe cleaners, sang and danced to songs, and practiced writing our Us as a part of larger words. We learned the sight word "and" through a rousing game of "I'm going on a picnic and..." Next week we will work on the letter B and add a sight word to our growing word bank. Ms. Shank's class worked on the letter B. We read some Mo Willems "Gerald and Piggie". We worked on a craft of the two characters. The students are doing well with handwriting. If they practice at home, remind them to always start at the top line when writing. Our letter for next week will be H and our sight word will be "are".

#### <u>Religion</u>

Ms. Wawner's class listened to the story of Daniel in the Lion's Den and talked about faith and courage. We practiced retelling the story by reviewing the setting, characters, and series of events. We decorated our door for Catholic Schools Week with the characters! Ms. Shank's class will read about Joseph and his coat of many colors. We were able to decorate our own beautiful coats. Our focus next week will be on Catholic Schools week and the many activities planned.

#### Science/Social Studies

Ms Wawner's class learned about the Lunar New Year in Social Studies. We read stories and watched videos about different traditions and celebrations that happen all over the world. We read the folktale of Nian, learned how to do the dragon dance, and created dragon puppets. Students loved the story "The Runaway Wok" and the show-and-tell wok Ms. Penarendando brought into class. They especially liked practicing how to use chopsticks! Ms. Shank's class continued learning about matter. We talked about the density of matter and tested things that would sink and float. We made predictions and were surprised that a grape, being so small, would sink. Next week we will continue with some experiments that focus on matter..
