

6th: This week the 6th graders started learning about Reconstruction. Next week they will start learning about Westward Expansion.

7th: This week the 7th graders learned about the manner in which the Soviet Union and the United States entered World War 2. Next week they will take their World War 2 Test.

8th: This week the 8th graders began their Middle Ages unit. Next week they will explore the Norse civilizations.

Math 6 (Garland): This past week, we got into a new unit, entitled, "Proportional Relationships". This coming week, we will get into Equivalent Ratios, Tables, and Graphs. This coming Thursday, we will quiz on Ratios and Equivalent ratios.

Pre-Algebra (Garland): Last week, we focused on solving inequalities, relating this skill back to solving equations. This week we will focus on solving inequality word problems and a mini/in-class project will be assigned, where students create, diagram, and solve their own inequality word-problems. I will assess inequalities through a take-home test, given on the 12th.

Geometry (Garland): This past week, we got into Trigonometry, solving sides/angles of right triangles using the ratios of Sine, Cosine, and Tangent. Next week we will use these skills to solve more complex area problems and revisit proofs, focusing on congruent Right Triangles, Hypotenuse Leg, and Hypotenuse Angle.

Math 7 (Reid): This past week we learned about scientific notation and learned how to compare numbers in various representations (fractions, decimals, percents, scientific notation. Next week we will conclude our unit on Number Sense and prepare for our next test. The next test on Number Sense will be when we start the 3rd quarter. Next Thursday, January 12th, the kids will have their 2nd quarter Binder Check which is a quiz grade. The format is exactly the same as last time. It will not be accepted late and it must be completed during class time on Thursday. Please remind your child to bring their computer to class next Thursday and ask them to show you their organized binder $\ensuremath{\mathfrak{U}}$

Algebra (Reid): This past week we learned about functions and function notation. Following functions, we will be learning how to write the equation of a line from given data as well as data that we collect in the real world and use it to predict future events. This unit on

6th Grade Composition (Kerrigan): This past week, we started our unit on pronouns. Students are learning proper usage for subject and object pronouns in a sentence. Given the short weeks, we will not resume *Vocabulary Power Plus* until after the four-day weekend.

6th Grade Literature (Kerrigan): This past week, we finished *A Long Walk to Water* and began discussing the writing process in regards to a compare and contrast essay on the main characters in our book. Students began on Friday with some brainstorming and will continue with a preliminary outline due next week. The next IRA is also due Tuesday and should be handed in digitally on Google Classroom.

7th Language Arts (Lowdon): The IRA is due on Tuesday. We begin a new vocabulary unit next week and finish reading *The Pearl*. There will be a writing assignment related to *The Pearl*; the due date will be the following week. In grammar, we begin a unit on conjunctions and their proper use in writing.

8th Language Arts (Lowdon): Congratulations to our winners in the Knights of Columbus Essay Contest: Gavin McGinn, Deanna Soika, and Lupe Trinidad! The IRA is due on Tuesday. We will continue to read *Lord of the Flies* next week. Students are to finish Chapter 8 for Monday. We begin Lesson 3, Worldly Wise vocabulary, next week. In grammar, we will review the proper use and diagramming of conjunctions.
