Social Studies

This week we finished talking about Hispanic Heritage Month. Next week we will start talking about how to be a good citizen.

Math

This week we started our unit on addition within 10. We learned some important vocabulary like addend and sum. We also learned some strategies to help us solve addition problems (counting on, part part whole, drawing a picture, using a number bond, and adding on a ten frame). Next week we will continue learning about addition.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Reading

This week we read and discussed the story, *Hoot and Peep*, which is a fiction book that looks at two owl siblings and how it is okay to be different. Our focus was on making connections to what we read (Text to Self, Text to World, and Text to Text) while reading. Next week we will read *If Your Monster Won't Go To Bed*.

<u>Grammar</u>

This week we looked at onomatopoeia- a word that mimics the sound of the actual thing or person described. Next week we will look at adjectives.

Writing

This week we wrote about owls and focused on the type of sentences we were writing (asking and telling) and punctuation that was needed. We further practiced our writing skills during Daily 5 writing activities.

Theology

This week, students met with the faith buddies to read about their chosen saint and began writing some of what they learned while reading for their saint report. In addition, they were introduced to the October tenet of the month, Collaborators, and Saints Zelie and Louis Martin, who are examples of how a collaborator shares their gifts for the benefit of others.

Science

This week we focused on social studies.
