Math

Unit 3 is in the books! Graded tests were sent home in folders on Wednesday. Congratulations to the Hawks for persevering during a challenging unit!

The Hawks will next turn their mathematical minds to addition and subtraction. Unit 4 will combine computation with problem solving. Our awesome adders and super subtractors will tackle both one- and two-step story problems, showing their mathematical thinking with pictures, equations, and words. A "readiness" diagnostic is in folders today.

Flex for fluency! Help your Hawk do some fluency "reps" each day to keep his/her mental math muscles in shape. It's the perfect activity for soccer sidelines or when cooped-up in carline!

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

In second grade, the literacy focus changes from "learning to read" to "reading to learn." The Hawks are tickled pink to be learning all about the world and cultures around them during Hispanic Heritage Month. Ask your cutie about Brazilian churrascsarias (all-you-can eat steakhouses!), the Chilean wilderness, and the Angel Falls in Venezuela.

The Hawks were treated to two fabulous read alouds this week: "Night in the Country" by Cynthia Rylant and "Miss Tizzy" by Libba Moore Gray. With eyes closed, the Hawks listened to the rich, descriptive language in each of these beautifully written books, and formed pictures in their heads before drinking in the exquisite illustrations present on the pages. Next, the Hawks shared the words and phrases that brought characters, setting, and events to life, evoking "movies in their heads." Using these books as inspiration for adding descriptive language to their own work, the Hawks plan to take their writing from drab to fab!
