This week students are learning about the Appalachian and Rocky Mountain range. They are making a passport and will include the geographic features of our North American continent on their maps.

Theology

This Week:

Students were busy working through their Christ In Us workbook, learning the St. Michael Prayer and about the Rosary, and practicing the tenant of the month, which is collaborating/working effectively with one another.

Next Week:

A major focus next week will be preparing for Mass on October 24th. 3rd grade will be responsible for the readings and being gift bearers on that day. While students from Mr. Little's class will be assigned these roles for this mass, all students will be practicing and learning about the different parts of mass, as well as procedural and customary aspects to the mass. Early December will be our second Mass of the year, and students from Ms. Grassi's class will then be selected. We will also continue learning about the Rosary and completing activities around the "Miracle of the Sun" and Our Lady of Fatima.

Science

This week students are learning about the earth's axis, rotation, and revolution around the sun and how it affects our seasons. We will also practice the six steps in the scientific method by learning the words in a song. They will be introduced to the eight phases of the moon.

• Third grade will be taking care of our small school garden. We need donations of various garden tools, shovels, and children's garden gloves to maintain our garden area.

Next week students will learn how the earth and moon interact in our solar system. They will begin by learning the different phases of the moon, and the difference between a solar and lunar eclipse.
