### Middle School

6th: This week the 6th graders created Civil War Trading Cards that detailed the lives of important Civil War figures. Next week they will discuss the battle of gettysburg.

7th: This week the 7th graders began their unit on the 1930s. Next week they will learn about the rise of Franklin Delano Roosevelt.



8th: This week the 8th graders finished their River Valley Civilizations Unit. Next week they will begin learning about Iron Age Empires in India and Persia.

Math 6 (Garland): We looked at integers as a form of movement within the Coordinate Plane this past Friday. On Monday and Tuesday, we will review for a test on Integer Operations, which will be on Wednesday, October 19th. (The students usually have my class on Thursday, however, since Thursday is a Day of Service and Friday is the end of the quarter,, we will be splitting our block day classes on Wednesday)

Pre-Algebra (Garland): We finished up this past week Simplifying Algebraic Expressions. I plan on quizzing the students, this coming Monday, on the skills of translating and simplifying Algebraic Expressions. We will then use the rest of the week to discuss Adding and Subtracting Monomials and relate Adding and Subtraction of Scientific Notation to this process.

Geometry (Garland): This past Friday, we started our new unit on Angles of Transversals. On Monday and Tuesday, we will fine tune this knowledge, centered around parallel lines. I will assign "A Parallel Town" project on Monday, which will be due on Monday, October 23rd. Students will create a fictitious town, with specific landmarks based on Angles of Transversals. It offers up a real life connection to how big cities are gridded off.

Math 7 (Reid): This past week, the kids took their 2nd test of the quarter on The Coordinate Plane, Order of Operations (GEMDAS) and Evaluating Expressions. On Tuesday, October 17th, the kids will have their 1st Quarter Binder Check which is a 20 point quiz grade weighted twice and it will not be accepted late. Please talk to your child about making sure they have no missing assignments in FACTS. On Mondays every week throughout the quarter, they have been getting a printed copy of anything missing in FACTS. The purpose of this has been to give them time to come talk to me and/or finish & turn in the assignments that are missing. Please remember that the end of the 1st Quarter is Friday, October 20th. On Sunday, October 15th I will be changing any assignment marked as "absent" to "missing" in FACTS if the student has not made up the assignment yet. It will still have a mark of "absent" in my paper gradebook. An "absent" assignment does not affect the numerical grade and a "missing" assignment in FACTS is a 0. Next week, we will continue working with expressions by simplifying and translating them.

Algebra (Reid): This past week, the kids took their 2nd test of the quarter on Solving Equations & Word Problems. On Tuesday, October 17th, the kids will have their 1st Quarter Binder Check which is a 20 point quiz grade weighted twice and it will not be accepted late. Please talk to your child about making sure they have no missing assignments in FACTS. On Mondays every week throughout the quarter, they have been getting a printed copy of anything missing in FACTS. The purpose of this has been to give them time to come talk to me and/or finish & turn in the assignments that are missing. Please remember that the end of the 1st Quarter is Friday, October 20th. On Sunday, October 15th I will be changing any assignment marked as "absent" to "missing" in FACTS if the student has not made up the assignment yet. It will still have a mark of "absent" in my

paper gradebook. An "absent" assignment does not affect the numerical grade and a "missing" assignment in FACTS is a 0. Next week, we will start to work with inequalities.

## Composition, Literature, and Language Arts -

6th Grade Composition (Kerrigan): This week we have been studying prepositional phrases, and next Tuesday we will have a test on them. As part of the test, students must recite verse 2 of the preposition song to me. Verse 3 will be extra credit on the test. Students who did not know verse 1 for the recitation quiz must know it by Monday, or it will go in the gradebook as a 0. The test will also include having to identify subjects, verbs and prepositional phrases in sentences, as well as doing basic sentence diagramming.

6th Grade Literature (Hernandez): This week, we read the second chapter of *A Long Way from Chicago*. The students were challenged to find points of comparison between the first and second chapters with a view towards analyzing the author's purpose. Next week, we will continue with the book. Our second IRA is due this coming Tuesday the 17th.

7th Language Arts (Hernandez): This week, we continued reading and annotating *The Giver*. We will continue with the book (and get quizzed on it) next week. Students completed a peer review of their speculative fiction stories and submitted a final draft. Our second IRA is due this coming Tuesday the 17th.

8th Language Arts (Hernandez): This week, we continued reading and analyzing *The Outsiders*. Students reflected on the character development of the protagonist and themes of fairness and morality in the novel thus far. We will continue with this discussion and read more of the book next week. Students also submitted a final draft of their personal narratives. Our second IRA is due this coming Tuesday the 17th.

6th(Mehl): This week we reviewed the chapter on God's plan for Salvation as it is contained in the Bible. As an exercise, the students did an abbreviated timeline of Salvation History. The students read the chapter on God the Father in the Bible and completed the reading guide on it. We also reviewed for Monday's test on Chapter 2. Service logs are due on October 18th.

7th(Mehl): This week we reviewed the chapter on the Acts of the Apostles, and the students did exercises focusing on Pentecost, St. Peter, and St. Paul. The students read the Chapter on the New Testament Letters and completed the reading guide. We also reviewed Chapter 20 for Monday's test. Service logs are due on October 18.

8th(Fallica and Bryan): This week we dove deeper into Church History. We focused on the fact that the first Christians were Jewish, soon followed by the Gentiles who contributed to the growth of the Church. Following Jesus brought about conflict and risk, with martyrdom becoming a reality for many. We began reading the Acts of the Apostles, and over the next

several weeks we will be discussing the lives of the Apostles and their roles in spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ. Service logs are due on October 18th.

Just as the Apostles spread the Good News of Jesus Christ, we must answer our call to serve others. October 19th is our Day of Service. Please help us out if you can, and volunteer to be a chaperone or driver. 1 John 4, "Those who love God must love their brothers and sisters".

6th: This week we mapped out where we are going following our intro to the cell. We overviewed the cell cycle, mitosis, meiosis, photosynthesis and cellular respiration. Next week we will investigate photosynthesis and cellular respiration and start to learn tinkercad for our first 3d printed project.

7th: This week we started to learn how to model atoms and molecules. We made models of water, methane and ethanol. We continued our discussion on the periodic table. Next week we will be assigned a periodic table to use as a tool to discover various elements.

8th: This week we worked in class on the solar system and lunar habitat projects. Next week we will continue learning about the seasons and tides and continue discussions on space exploration.

6th(DeMaio): This week students worked in groups to learn to identify and say out loud vocabulary related to the calendar. They also began to work on learning about Gender and the number of nouns in Spanish. Next week we will continue learning more about this topic.

7th(DeMaio): This week the students did a practice with the goal to prepare for the oral Spanish quiz related to the calendar this coming Tuesday 17th. They also carried out activities with numbers and learned some rules such as: What is the difference between Veinte and Veinti? When counting in Spanish from 21 to 29, the veinte becomes veinti, and the word for the individual digit gets tacked on to form a single compound word. So "twenty-one" becomes veintiuno, "twenty-six" becomes veintiséis...They also worked on their auténtico practice books and did activities with the letter h and its sounds. Next week we will continue learning more numerical and grammar rules. How to tell the time and more about nouns.

8th(Mehl): This week we worked on listening, reading, and conversation skills. We have a new vocabulary list, which focuses on objects in the bedroom, colors, and comparative and superlative adjectives. Our grammatical focus is on the verbs *poder* and *dormir*. On Monday we will have a quiz on these verbs. The students have Quizlet sets to help them study both vocabulary and grammar. We also watched the second episode of the mystery series that we started last week.
