Math

Students took a formative assessment on addition strategies and skills and then began working on subtraction.

Next week, we will look at how addition and subtraction related to one another, specifically focusing on missing addends, related facts, and fact families. The development of these skills will assist students as we prepare to move on to adding and subtracting larger numbers soon.

Reading

This week, students participated in their small reading groups, continued to read and answer questions from their Saint text, and learned about nonfiction text features.

Next week, we will continue to review fiction versus nonfiction elements.

Writing

This week, students used their researched questions to help develop their Saint writing.

Next week, students will complete the final draft of their Saint writing. We will also review parts of speech, particularly common and proper nouns.

Science / Social Studies

This week, we reviewed the parts of a map--the legend, scale, and compass rose. We also reviewed the cardinal directions--north, south, east, and west.

Next week, we will apply our map skill knowledge by creating a map.

Religion

This week, students learned that we are created in God's image and has made us to be good and holy. We also learned that we are called to trust God through His gift of Faith.

Next week, we explore and answer the question, "Who is Jesus?" focusing on the mystery of the Incarnation and how He is the greatest gift that God has given us.

Spelling

Spelling words will be handed out again this week. Homework will resume.
