Math

This Week: Students will learn how to round to the nearest ten, hundred and thousand with a four digit number using their number lines and rounding mountain strategies.

Next Week: Students will be learning about number patterns and decomposing numbers to help solve real world problems. They will learn and apply strategies when adding three and four digit numbers.

This Week:

We focused our energy this week into reviewing verbs and analyzing characters (Thinking and speaking like the character, The storyteller's point of view, and using text evidence). The students had fun gaining new insights from the very familiar *Three Little Pigs* story through the eyes of the wolf and his perspective (*The True Story of the Three Little Pigs*).

Theology

This Week:

We began examining who Jesus Christ is in our Christ In Us Workbook (1.4). We learned that the Rosary should be a meditative devotion bringing us closer to both Mary and God as we examine the mysteries, or big events, in the life of Jesus and Mary.

Science

This Week: Students will learn the parts of a plant and the function of each part to assist in the growth of the plant. They will be introduced to the process of photosynthesis and pollination.

Next Week: Students will begin working on their project on drawing and labeling the parts of an animal and plant cell. Students will learn what plants need to live through our observations of planting their seeds and noting in a log each week any changes which may have occurred to their seeds.
