Teacher's Message/Announcements

- The deadline for selecting your child's yearbook picture and ordering prints is Monday, October 23. We cannot guarantee delivery of prints before Thanksgiving for orders submitted after October 23. If you do not select a picture to be used in the yearbook, one will be selected for you.
- **Tuesday, October 31**, will be our Halloween Parade for students in JK-2nd Grade, and Halloween Tag Day for students in 3rd-8th. The parade will be held at 8:15am. JK-2 parents are welcome to join us--we will have you line up along the sidewalk and blacktop as long as we are able to be outside; you do not need to come into the building.

Students in JK-2 may wear an appropriate Halloween costume to school, but they must be able to remove it, and be in their school uniform, if it is uncomfortable or distracting. Masks and props are not permitted, and students should be in their school-approved shoes.

For Tag Day, students in grades 3-8 must be in their uniforms, but may wear Halloween-themed accessories. Parameters for those accessories are as follows:

- **Allowed:** socks, belts, earrings, necklace, ribbons, bracelets, headbands with stabilized decor (i.e. cat ears)
- **Not Allowed:** hats, sunglasses, wigs, masks, t-shirts, headbands with flying objects, anything flashing, teeth/fangs, costumes

Social Studies

This week students will explore South America and learn about the geographic features. They will begin with The Amazon River and the Amazon Rainforest. Students will identify both geographic features on a map of South America.

Next week students will learn facts about The Amazon River, Amazon Rainforest, and the Andes Mountain range. Students will identify all geographic features on a map of South America.

Math

This week students will compare and order numbers using the greater than, less than, and equal to signs, up to the hundred thousands place. They will be introduced to strategies on how to round three digit numbers to the nearest ten.

Next week students will learn strategies on how to round three and four digit numbers to the nearest ten and hundred. They will also be introduced to a four step plan on solving word/story problems.

Theology

This Week:

Next Week:

Charlottesville Catholic School will present a sexual abuse prevention program, the *Teaching Safety – Empowering God's Children* program, to our students next week. The creators of the *Protecting God's Children*[®] program developed the *Teaching Safety – Empowering God's Children* program. This program is required by the Catholic Diocese of Richmond as outlined in the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People* as a part of our ongoing effort to help create and maintain a safe environment for children and to protect all children from sexual abuse.

One lesson per semester will be presented to all students at Charlottesville Catholic School. Each lesson will be approximately 45 minutes in length and for 3rd grade will cover Physical Boundaries - Safe Touching Rules (Lesson 1-Fall) and Safe Adults, Safe Touches, and Special Safe Adults (Lesson 2-Spring). We encourage you to read the *Teaching Boundaries and Safety Guide* so that you are aware of the nature of the *Teaching Safety – Empowering God's Children* program. To ensure the school and family connection remains strong, we will communicate the exact date of each lesson prior to the lesson being taught.

Science

This week students will learn how the earth and moon interact in our solar system. They will begin by learning the different phases of the moon, and the difference between a solar and lunar eclipse.
