## Science/Social Studies

Ms. Wawner's class celebrated apple season this week by learning the parts of an apple and an apple's life cycle. We dissected an apple, did a taste test of three types, and performed an experiment to answer the question "Why do apple's turn brown when you cut them?" We are excited about our upcoming field trip to Carter's Mountain. Next week, we will focus on pumpkins and compare/contrast pumpkins with apples. Ms. Shank's class studied the life cycle of the pumpkin. We made life cycle hats. We also put our scientist hats on and hypothesized how many seeds we would find in our carved pumpkin. We had guesses from 1 to 50. It ended up being 239 and we still hadn't counted them all. They were a little bit shocked. Next week we are going to study apples in preparation for our Field Trip

## Math

Ms. Wawner's class continued to work on teen numbers this week through identification and one-to-one correspondence. Students went on a scavenger hunt for teen numbers around the room, played teen numbers bingo, and exercised while counting. Students will focus on greater, than/less than next week. Ms. Shank's class finished our unit on sorting. We sorted by size,

shape, color, and kind. We began working on teen numbers, both recognition and counting sets. We will continue with that and begin with comparing numbers as well.

# Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Ms. Wawner's class enjoyed reading books by Tomie dePaola this week. We talked about how he uses many of the same characters in different books, how his books often take place in Italy and have Italian words in them and how his illustrations all look similar. Students especially loved the book "Pancakes for Breakfast" as they got to make up the story through pictures. Students reviewed our SATPIN letters this week and will start learning about the letter C next week. Ms. Shank's class read a lot of books about pumpkins and fall. We also studied the letter I and made insects.

# Theology

Ms. Shank's class continued our study of the Bible hero David. We read some Psalms and talked about the different types of Psalms. Ms Wawner's class finished up our unit on Noah and will begin to learn about David. Ms. Shank's class revisited the idea of kindness. We made a kindness flower where the students drew examples of kindness. We are going to continue working on social skills. Next week we will talk about All Saints Day.
