### Social Studies

This week in Social Studies, we worked on a collaborative map project. Next week we will complete a project based on the 5 regions of Virginia!

#### Math

This week in Math we have been focused on reasonable vs. unreasonable estimates for word problems, and factors and multiples. We took our Chapter 3 test, and have a deeper understanding of multiplication and division foundations. Next week, we will begin Chapter 4: "Multiply with one-digit numbers."

## Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week in Language Arts, students worked on grounding their evidence for claims in the text. Students are getting really strong with this skill and their writing skills are dramatically improving! We also have been learning about different types of nouns in grammar.

Next week, we will finish up with *The Tiger Rising* and dive deeper into the characters of the story.

There will be a spelling test over list 4 on Friday, October 28.

# Religion

This week in Religion, we have been focused on the Joyful mysteries and reviewing for our Unit 1 test. We have also been reflecting on how we can bring Christ into the world as the first disciples did, and how we can use our special gifts God has given us to do so. We look forward to our Day of service next Friday.

### Science

In Science this week we enjoyed our review games and shaping our study skills for the Chapter 3 test. We are excited to start our adaptations project, due October 28th! This is an in and out of class project. Students will have 3 class periods next week to work on their projects. They received the project packet with directions and a rubric this week in class. Students will need a poster board and should start on this as soon as possible.

The Chapter 3 test is scheduled for Tuesday, 10/25.

#### Halloween Information:

Monday, October 31, will be our Halloween Parade for students in JK-2nd Grade, and Halloween Tag Day for students in 3rd-8th. The parade will be held at 8:15am. JK-2 parents are welcome to join us!
