## Curriculum

#### Math

This week we continued our addition unit. We reviewed addition-related vocabulary such as add, addends, parts and whole (number bonds), how many more, sum, join, and in all. We practiced addition strategies such as using doubles to add and the commutative property of addition (adding in any order). Next week, we will continue to review addition strategies while introducing our subtraction unit and key vocabulary (difference, subtract, take from, take apart, how many fewer, and how many more) as well as discussing how subtraction relates to addition.

#### **Reading and Language Arts**

#### Reading

This week we read and discussed the story, *Pumpkin Soup*. This book tells the story of three friends (Cat, Squirrel, and Duck) who must learn to navigate the difficulties that come with friendships. We focused on literary devices such as rhythm, rhyme, and repetition, which the story uses for effect. Next week we will read *The Girl Who Thought in Pictures* and explore the connections between individuals and ideas.

#### Grammar

This week we focused on punctuating our sentences. We did several activities where we identified the appropriate ending punctuation (question vs. exclamation). We also practiced building and sorting sentences with the proper sentence structure (nouns, verbs, adjectives). Next week we will talk about putting words in ABC order.

#### Word Study/Spelling

We practiced sorting our words and chunking syllables, focused on the consonant digraph sound /ch/. We looked at the spelling rules for when /ch/ is spelled with a ch (church, lunch, beach) and tch (after short vowels - witch, catch), and took our weekly spelling quiz. Next week students will receive a new word sort (spelling list).

#### Writing

This week we wrote about our story, *Pumpkin Soup*, and pumpkins. Inspired by the story, we practiced adding repetition, rhythm and rhyme to our own writing. We also crafted question-sentences and exclamation-sentences. We continued practicing our writing skills during Daily 5 writing activities as well.

#### Religion

This week we continued working in our Mary interactive notebook. We completed a Mary story wheel and sequenced the story on Mary in our notebooks, and completed a Mary faith brainstorm where we talked about why Mary was a hero and how we can be heroes like Mary. Next week, we will complete a faithful brainstorm-writing four ways we can be faithful like Mary. We will also complete a Mary true/false sort and wrap up our unit on Mary with a Mary BINGO game.

#### Science/ Social Studies

We discussed how scientists use notebooks to write down questions, answers, information, and observations. This helps them to understand the world around them. We talked about how scientists make observations by looking around the world they live in. We learned that scientists investigate. We learned that scientists make a plan, ask questions, make observations, and share their results with those around them.

Math- 1st Quarter Week 4 Math Sheet - Complete one activity each night (M - Th).

**Reading-** Read for 15 min./night. Please record the title of the book that was read each night. Additionally, for each completed book, your child will color in their reading log for the month (e.g.October books = candy corn). Don't forget the monthly reading challenge that was included in the binder as well. These activities are designed to motivate readers/encourage students to have fun with reading. It's optional, but highly recommended.

**Word Study/Spelling**- Students should sort their Word Study/Spelling words each night as well as work on **3** activities total of their choosing from the Weekly Spelling Menu (**M - Th**, 10 min./night).
