#### JK-2 Halloween Parade and 3-8 TAG Day

Thursday, October 31, will be our Halloween Parade for students in JK-2nd Grade. The parade will be held at approximately 8:15AM, directly after morning rosary. JK-2 parents are welcome to join us! Parents may stand on the sidewalk or on the blacktop, if we are able to be outside. It is not necessary to come into the building

<u>Students in JK-2</u> may wear an appropriate Halloween costume to school, but they must be able to remove it, and be in their school uniform, if it is uncomfortable or distracting. Masks and props are not permitted, and students should be in their school approved shoes.

- Thursday, October 31, will be Halloween Tag Day for students in 3rd-8th.
  Students must be in their uniforms, but may wear Halloween-themed accessories. Parameters for those accessories are as follows:
  - Allowed: socks, belts, earrings, necklace, ribbons, bracelets, headbands with stabilized decor (i.e. cat ears)
  - Not Allowed: hats, sunglasses, wigs, masks, t-shirts, headbands with flying objects, anything flashing, teeth/fangs, costumes

### **Social Studies**

This week in SS, students began our new unit which focuses on Native American history. Students learned about how Native Americans have lived in Virginia for thousands of years and which regions different tribes were. We also learned about archaeology and how scientists learn from artifacts!

Next week, we will continue this unit.

#### Math

This week in Math, we finished our unit on patterns and had our test on what we have learned. Next week we will begin multi-digit multiplication strategies. Please continue to review multiplication facts at home with your child. Knowing these basic facts helps significantly with their understanding of these strategies.

## Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week in LA, students finished our newest novel, *The Tiger Rising*. This is a wonderful story that students are thoroughly enjoying. Students have been working on looking at other story elements in novels such as theme and meaning in recurring objects in the story. I have been very impressed with how deep the discussions have been and how much students are picking up from these lessons!

Next week, we will watch The Tiger Rising movie and complete a few other activities based on the novel. I have also sent an email regarding the movie.

## Theology

This week in Theology, we talked about the Eucharist and parts of the Mass. Students also practiced Lexio Divina in the chapel. Next week we will do a special lesson from the Diocese. Please see below for more information.

Charlottesville Catholic School will present a sexual abuse prevention program, the Teaching Safety – Empowering God's Children program, to our students over the next two weeks. The creators of the Protecting God's Children® program developed the Teaching Safety – Empowering God's Children program. This program is required by the Catholic Diocese of Richmond as outlined in the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People as a part of our ongoing effort to help create and maintain a safe environment for children and to protect all children from sexual abuse.

One lesson per semester will be presented to all students at Charlottesville Catholic School. Each lesson will be approximately 45 minutes in length and will cover "Boundaries: You Have Rights," and "Secrets, Surprises, and Promises." We encourage you to read the Teaching Boundaries and Safety Guide so that you are aware of the nature of the Teaching Safety – Empowering God's Children program. To ensure the

school and family connection remains strong, we will communicate the exact date of each lesson prior to the lesson being taught.

## Science

This week on Science, we began our unit on weather. The students enjoyed doing a group "Brain Dump" to start out. Then we looked at the difference between weather and climate. We also looked at and learned about different tools meteorologists use to track the weather.
