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## Social Studies/Science

Our unit on Matter is winding down, but the excitement is still building! This week the Hawks experimented with mystery liquids, balloon rockets, and dancing raisins. On Halloween, we'll use our knowledge of Matter to create ghost balloons, make a pumpkin puke, and follow a recipe for elephant toothpaste! As super scientists, the Hawks are using

the scientific method, collaboration, and a growth mindset to explore the world around them.

In our next unit, we'll turn our focus back to Social Studies to learn all about the symbols and traditions that honor and foster patriotism in the United States of America, as well as the responsibilities of a good citizen.

## Math

Perky problem solvers! The Hawks used critical thinking and collaboration to solve two-step story problems, using mathematical vocabulary to help them identify a strategy and represent their thinking with equations. The Hawks also had ample opportunities to write and solve their own story problems.

## Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Each week, our spectacular spellers participate in a variety of activities, such as Draw and Label, Rainbow Write, Sentences, Hangman, and Practice Tests. Ample opportunities to work with these words and their featured patterns create spelling success!

In keeping with the holiday season, our spooky second graders are reading Halloween themed passages to build comprehension. Ask your child about Vampire Bats, Frankenstein, and the History of Halloween! This festive theme will continue next week with our dive into the religious origin of Halloween as well as All Saints Day!

As readers, the Hawks are turning their focus to fluency, expression, and intonation with the art of acting. Our reader's theater production of "A Native American Cinderella" is bringing character, setting, and plot to life! We can't wait for our stage debut!

The Hawks have been flexing their writing muscles, too! As the first quarter comes to a close, these super second graders are building writing stamina, becoming more consistent with capitalization and punctuation, adding descriptive language to their pieces, and including details to tell their reader more, all while using the writing process to draft, conference, and edit their work.

# Theology
