## Science/Social Studies

Ms. Wawner's class studied the life cycle and parts of a pumpkin this week. We read the story of Pumpkin Jack and learned how pumpkins start as seeds, can end as Jack-o-lanterns, and then return to the earth to start the cycle over again. We dissected our pumpkin named Gerry and found out there were 515 seeds in him! We also made a pumpkin-cano. Ask your students what happens when you combine vinegar and baking soda in a pumpkin! Ms. Shank's class studied the life cycle of apples. Next week we will be studying bears and animal changes with an emphasis on animal adaptations, (migration, hibernation, dormancy, and behavioral and physical adaptations). We continue to work on kindness and how we can demonstrate it to our peers and adults. We are also going to be working on other social skills such as identifying whether it is a big problem or a small problem and regulating our emotions according to that, how to be a good friend and sharing, how to deal with controlling our bodies to be safe to ourselves and others, cleaning up after ourselves, and manners when we eat and in the bathroom. I am hoping that when we work on table manners.

## Math

Ms. Wawner's class focused on comparing numbers up to 20. We learned how to write the greater than/ less than symbol, as well as the equals sign. We also continued our practice on

writing our numbers. Soon, students should be able to write the numbers 0-9. Next week, we will focus on sorting. Ms. Shank's class will continue working on teen numbers, both recognition and counting sets. Some students are still struggling counting sets to ten and recognizing their numbers. Any practice at home is helpful. We have been working on number sense as well, (for example, if you have the number 17 how many ten frames do you need, how many in each ten frame), as well as subitizing our number sets to become more automatic when we see groups of objects. We will continue with that and begin with comparing numbers as well.

# Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Ms. Wawner's class learned about the letter C this week, focusing on the hard c. We made caterpillars in the shape of a C and students loved making collages. We read both fiction and non-fiction books on pumpkins. Next week, we will focus on the letter O and read Halloween stories. Ms. Shank's class read a lot of books about apples and fall. We also studied the letter N. We will study the letter C next week. We will also begin differentiated literacy groups. Some students will begin pre-reading skills by "reading" text. Other students who still need support with letter and letter sound will be working on that. Our sight word will be "the". Students will bring home their book on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. They should practice reading those books to you. I will be sending a note home explaining the methodology of learning to read and what you can do to help them when they bring their books home.

# Theology

Ms. Wawner's class learned the story of David & Goliath. We talked about how David had faith, courage, and used his special gifts. We brainstormed times we were brave and came up with ideas of what some of our special gifts are. We also had fun learning how to use a sling shot. We practiced shooting poms poms at our 9-foot Goliath. Next week we will learn about All Saints Day. Mrs. Shank's class talked about what a Saint is and how we can all be Saints by trying to live our life like Jesus. We learned about a variety of Saints. We will continue to learn about Saints.
