### **Social Studies**

This week in Social Studies, we completed a project on the 5 regions of Virginia. Students created salt dough and used the salt dough to create a 3 dimensional model of the 5 regions on cardboard. This was a very fun and engaging activity that the students enjoyed. Thank you to those who donated cardboard for the project!

We also began chapter 2 which focuses on Native American history.

### Math

In Math this week we started Chapter 4- "Multiplying by one-digit numbers." We enjoyed learning about multiplication with multiples of ten, hundreds, and thousands. We also learned how to round and estimate products and used base-ten place value models to multiply.

The Chapter 4 Math Test is scheduled for the week of November 7th.

# Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week in Language Arts, students finished *The Tiger Rising* and started to look beyond characters in their stories. We discussed the importance of setting, mood/tone, and the themes of stories. The goal is for students to start looking deeper into the books they read and to see all of what author's do to create engaging stories.

Next week, students will write an alternate ending to The Tiger Rising.

# Religion

In Religion this week we started the Sorrowful Mysteries. We also began Unit 2 Lesson 6 and have been focused on the essential question, "How does God share his life with us?" We learned about the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, and have been reflecting on ways we can share in God's life beyond the sacraments such as being prepared and fully present for Mass. Shout out to the 4th grade and our amazing parent volunteers for a successful day of service writing letters for the patients at the UVA hospital, and putting together care bags for the Haven.

Our Unit 2 Lesson 6 Religion Quiz is scheduled for next week.

### Science

In Science this week we took our Ch. 3 Test, and have enjoyed using class time to work on our adaptation projects. The projects were due today, and presentations will continue next week.

#### Halloween Information:
