Social Studies

This week we started talking about Hispanic Heritage Month. We talked about what it is and why we celebrate it. Next week we will make a collaborative poster that will be brought in during Mass.

Math

This week we finished up our number sense study and took an assessment. The assessment was read to the students so because of that the highest grade students were able to receive was a 2. We also started our unit on addition. We learned about the vocabulary words addend/part, sum/whole, plus sign and equal sign. Next week we will continue our unit on addition.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Reading

This week we read and discussed the story, *Real Cowboys*., which is nonfiction and aims to paint the real picture of who cowboys are and what they really do. Our focus was on asking questions and identifying question words (Who, What, Where, Why, When, and How, etc.) while reading. We stressed how good readers ask questions before they read, while they read, and after they read. Next week we will read *Hoot and Peep*, and focus on making connections (text to self, text to text, and text to world).

Grammar

This week we looked at asking sentences (?) vs. telling sentences (.) and how to tell them apart. Identifying words like, who, what, where, when, why, and how, can help determine what type of sentence it is and what punctuation is needed. Next week we will talk about onomatopoeia- a word that mimics the sound of the actual thing or person described.

<u>Writing</u>

This week we focused on the type of sentences we were writing (asking and telling) and punctuation that was needed. We further practiced our writing skills during Daily 5 writing activities

Theology

This week, in honor of Hispanic Heritage Month, we learned about St. Juan Diego, Our Lady of Guadalupe and St. Martin de Porres. We, also, learned about how the most important job for our communion of Saints is intercession or praying for us. Students were also introduced to their upcoming Saint Report that we'll be completing throughout the month of October and

chose the saints they will be researching. Be on the lookout for an email with your students' chosen saint and help them learn more at home to prepare them for their report!

Science

This week we focused on social studies.
