#### **Service Opportunities:**

 We are excited to be hosting Coffee & Muffins at St. Thomas Aquinas 4 weekends this year (October 27, December 15, January 26, and April 6). In order to do this, we will need volunteers to both bake muffins and staff the table each of the Sundays (Middle School students can do either one, and may count the time for church or community service). Muffins will need to be delivered to school no later than 8:15AM on preceding Friday (for October 27, muffins will be due by Friday, October 25). - Martha's Market is not just a marketplace; it is a community-driven initiative dedicated to supporting women's health and the fight against breast cancer. Last year, thanks to the tireless efforts of our volunteers and the generous support of our community, the Women's Committee raised nearly \$185,000. These funds were instrumental in providing 200 free breast health exams to women who are underinsured or uninsured in our community. We also continued contributing to Marianne's Room assisting more than 1,000 women with wigs, scarves, lotions, shampoos, advice and more during their cancer journey as well as funding the spring Fly Fling trip as part of the healing journey. To make this year's event even more successful, we need volunteers to assist with various tasks, including:
  - -Set- Up: Carrying boxes, unloading cars, and potentially directing traffic as vendors set up their booths. We have 45 incredible vendors who will be setting up between 6 and 9am. (Early, I know!)
  - -Break- Down: Assisting vendors with packing up, ensuring the venue is clean and organized after the event, and potentially directing traffic. Breakdown will take from 4 to 5:30pm.
  - -Balloon Delivery: At 10:00 we need a few volunteers to pick up pre-ordered balloon bouquets from The Party Starts Here in Barracks Road and deliver them to about a dozen participating businesses at or close to the downtown mall.

Volunteers' efforts will make a significant impact on the success of the event and the health and well-being of women in our community. 6th Grade US History: This week the 6th graders finished their Civil War Unit. Next week they start learning about the postwar south.

7th Grade US History: This week the 7th graders finished their 1920s unit beg. Next week we will move into the 1930s by exploring the stock market crash of 1929. They are also competing in a virtual stock market competition. Be prepared for your children to be looking for stock tips!



8th Grade World History: This week the 8th graders finished their River Valley Civilizations unit. Next week they will begin learning about Iron Age Empires, staring with the Muaryan and Gupta empires.

Math 6 (Garland): This past week, we focused on integer multiplication and division. This coming week, we will advance our "Pre-Algebraic knowledge" by working with integer operations and GEMDAS. We will then assign directions to integers by exploring their positions on the coordinate plane.

Pre-Algebra (Garland): This past week, we started unit 2, entitled, "Algebraic Expressions". This coming week, we are going to focus on Combining Like Terms, the Distributive Property, and a systematic way of simplifying expressions; distributing first (if needed) followed by combining like terms.

Geometry (Garland): This past week, we worked with Angle Pairs, finishing up Unit 1. When students return on Tuesday, we will review for a test on "Logic, Coordinate Geometry, and Terminology". Students will test this coming Thursday. On Friday, we will start to discover angles associated with transversals, which kicks off a new unit.

Math 7 (Reid): This past week we continued to work with the idea of simplifying completely. The kids learned that there can be no parentheses and no like terms in their final answers. This may mean that they need to distribute to get rid of the parentheses and combine any like terms they have. Next week, the kids will have their 2nd test of the quarter on Using Order of Operations & Simplifying Completely on their block day next week (10.09 or 10.10). The kids will also have their 1st Quarter Binder Check on Tuesday, October 15th. This is a 20 point quiz grade weighted twice in the gradebook and will not be dropped as a lowest mini quiz grade.

Algebra (Reid): This past week the kids took their 2nd test of the quarter on Solving Equations & Word Problems. We also started to solve and graph inequalities. Next week, the kids will continue with solving and graphing compound inequalities. The kids will also have their 1st Quarter Binder Check on Tuesday, October 15th. This is a 20 point quiz grade weighted twice in the gradebook and will not be dropped as a lowest mini quiz grade.

# Composition, Literature, and Language Arts -

6th Grade English Composition (Kerrigan): This week, we wrapped up our unit on prepositions with a test and completed lesson 5 in *Vocabulary Power Plus*. Next week, we will study lesson 6 vocabulary, as well as compound sentences.

6th Grade Literature Vocabulary (Kerrigan): This week, we enjoyed using the performance space for our slides presentations and read through Chapter 3 of *A Long Way from Chicago*. Students should be reading Chapter 4 over the weekend, and we will continue in our novel study next week.

7th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, we worked on three different assignments. Students created a padlet showing themes and other story elements for "Jack-in-the-Box." They also worked on the rough draft of the speculative fiction writing project and read more of *Dandelion Wine*. Next week, we will do peer review for the project and submit a final draft. We will also do some analysis activities related to *Dandelion Wine*.

Students should be reading their IRA books. Our second IRA of the quarter is due **Tuesday**, **October 15th**.

8th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, we read two narratives from the great G. Talese, "Wartime Sunday" and "The Silent Season of a Hero." These two works finish up sports-related narratives. Next week, we will start to close out our narrative nonfiction unit with essays about family, nature, and a sense of place. We will start working on a second first-person narrative which will be due at the end of the first quarter.

Students should be reading their IRA books. Our second IRA of the quarter is due **Tuesday**, **October 15th**.

Spanish 1 [Part 1–7th grade] (DeMaio): This week the sixth grade students reviewed the 21 Hispanic countries, reviewing the definitions of being Hispanic, Latino, and heritage.

They also finished with the review topic to "para empezar" by closing with the topic "The weather." They started learning a new topic ""Mis amigos y yo " subtopic ¿Y que te gusta hacer? =And what do you like to do? By the end of this chapter students will be able to: Listen to and read about activities people like and don't like to do. Talk and write about what you and others like and don't like to do. Describe your favorite activities and ask others about theirs. Students will use: Vocabulary, Activities, Expressing likes and dislikes, Grammar: Infinitives, Negatives, Expressing agreement or disagreement.

Spanish 1 [Part 2-8th grade](DeMaio): This week the eighth grade students reviewed the 21 Hispanic countries, reviewing the definitions of being Hispanic, Latino, and heritage. They finished with the review of the topic "Tu dia en la escuela" = "Your day at school" and started this week with the topic "Los Pasatiempos" = "Hobbies" subtopic "¿Adónde vas?" = Where are you going? By the end of this chapter students will be able to: Listen and read about leisure activities and schedules. Talk and write about places to go and activities in their free time. Exchange information about weekend plans. **Culture**: Understand the meaning and role of children in the Spanish-speaking world. Compare leisure activities in the Spanish-speaking

United States. The students will use: vocabulary, leisure activities, and places in the community. **Grammar:** The verb ir, Asking questions.

They also participated in the contest related to the movie "Pachama" which showed the indigenous culture of the country of Peru, the Incas and other small tribes. They had fun with this activity of questions and comparisons with Christianity and how the conquistadors acted during the colonization in Latin America.
