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Social Studies

Following our study of the Powhatan tribe of the Eastern Woodlands and the Lakota tribe of the Great Plains, these sweet second graders studied the Pueblo tribe of the Southwest, and learned how they adapted to their desert environment. From adobe homes to farms with irrigation, this tribe could do it all! The Hawks built their third and final living village, and finished the week strong with a festive game of Jeopardy to review all three tribes for an upcoming quiz!

Next week, we'll conclude this unit with a brief study of Christopher Columbus and a special guest visit about the tribes of the Pacific Northwest. Our very own Mrs. Christine Shank (JK Teacher extraordinaire!) will be sharing some exquisite artifacts with our studious second graders.

Math

Unit 3 is winding down! The Hawks have expertly navigated skip counting using arrays, as well as by 2s, 5s, 10s, and 100s; identified observable patterns when skip counting by 10s and 100s, both on and off decade/century; determined whether a number is even or odd; and utilized arrays to find the sum of equal addends. Here is some math vocabulary to drop in your dinner time chats: column, row, repeated addition, array, skip count, even, and odd.

Our math curriculum is very rigorous, and challenges the Hawk mathematicians to not only think critically, but to also explain their thinking. This is a developing skill for all second graders.

In the first quarter, the Hawks will answer many of these types of questions orally and with pictures to learn how to formulate a response as they work towards transferring oral responses to written responses. Keep up the good work of supporting your Hawk at home!

Fluency fans! The Hawks are spreading their wings as mathematicians, and are beginning the challenging work of fact fluency. My goal for these stupendous second graders is to move away from counting fingers and using manipulatives to solve computation problems, and instead commit these facts to memory. Our classroom will have numerous fact fluency resources and games to strengthen mental math skills. Please also give your Hawk's brain a math workout at home each day by practicing fact fluency 2-3 minutes daily.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Radiant readers! The Hawks read nonfiction passages related to both mapping and Hispanic Heritage Month, focusing on the skills of decoding and comprehension. Your little bookworm brought each of these passages home this week for optional re-reading. Re-reading passages is a great way to build vocabulary and fluency (both intonation and speed)!

Super storytellers! After a brief author study of Donald Crews, author of "Bigmamas" and "Shortcut," the Hawks tried their hand at using life experiences to write "It Happened to Me stories." From stories about trips to the beach to accidental arcade theft, the Hawks had me on the edge of my seat!

Our first full week of spelling instruction and homework went swimmingly! Please check folders for today's spelling test. Due to the short week, new words will not be introduced, and <u>there will not be spelling homework 10/9-10/13.</u>

Theology

Our Saint Projects are full-steam ahead! A huge thank you to Anton Korinek and Colleen Karvetski, who joined our class to assist with reading and research this week! Students also learned the five-finger prayer method (pray for those closest to you, people who point you in the right direction, world and church leaders, those who need help, and ourselves.
