Science

This week students will learn about animal habitats and how living things grow and change in their environment. Students will be introduced to five new vocabulary words associated with the lifecycle of a butterfly. We will also continue to learn the steps of the scientific method.

Next week students will learn about the life cycle of plants and animals. They will observe the rate of seed growth through our experiment with three different seeds.

Social Studies

This week will be complete learning about the geographic features of North America .

Next week students will learn about South America and its geographic features- The Amazon, and the Andes Mountain range.

Math

This week we will learn how to round numbers to the nearest ten and nearest hundred using the strategy of a rounding mountain and number line. Students continue to work on counting currency and coins.

Next week we will review rounding numbers to the ten and nearest hundred. They will be introduced to rounding to the nearest thousand with a three and four digit number. Students will continue to work on counting currency and coins.

Language Arts/Writing

This Week:

Our focus was on Adjectives, as well as Long a & Vowel Team Syllables (**ai-aim and brain** comes at the beginning or in the middle of a consonant and **ay-essay and display** comes at the end of a consonant), Affixes: introduced **er/or** and reviewed ly, ing, e/es, ed, un, and re. We continued writing summaries by using the Somebody Wanted But So Then strategy, as well as introduced other organizational strategies and graphic organizers to support writing.

Homework:

Reading

This Week:

We finished our discussion of the book, *Pinduli* and reviewed vocabulary. We also practiced Describing Characters, Character Traits & Emotions as we read through the book.

Students were assigned *Mysteries according to Humphrey*, Ch. 6-10 (pages 53-104) this week. Time was given to read/listen to the book during class time, but it was also suggested that students utilize Learning Ally at home during their 20 min. of recommended nightly reading to remain on pace. They can find the book on their virtual "Book Shelf."

Religion

This Week:

We began Lesson 3 in our Religion textbook (Asking the questions, Who Is God and How do we see his love? We also continued learning about the Rosary and its purpose, prayers of the Rosary, and related scripture. Since we are praying the Sorrowful Mysteries for the month of October (every Tuesday), we focused our initial discussions on those moments in Jesus' life.

Next Week:

We will continue working in our Religion textbook (Lesson 3). We will also be diving deeper into the Rosary (a Catholic devotion consisting of praying common prayers) and the additional mysteries (Joyful, Luminous, and Glorious).
