## **Social Studies**

This week we finished up our unit on being a good citizen by writing and illustrating how we can be a good citizen in our community. We also took a "test" to close out our unit. Next week we will start learning about Election Day and we will even host our own class election. Look out for the results!

## Math

This week we continued our unit on addition and talked about making ten, adding to 20 on a number line, the commutative property, and word problems to 20. Next week we will wrap up our unit on addition and start our unit on subtraction.

# Language Arts/Reading/Writing

### Reading

This week we read and discussed the story, *The Girl Who Thought in Pictures*. This book was our first nonfiction-featured story (biography - Temple Grandin). Grandin is a remarkable woman with an amazing story that can teach us about overcoming obstacles, hard work, and pursuing your passion/dreams. Our focus skills of the week were all about nonfiction text structures and how a nonfiction text can still feel like a narrative (story). Next week we will read and explore the story *Maddi's Fridge* by Lois Brandt.

#### <u>Grammar</u>

This week we focused on ABC order. We completed several activities where students needed to identify and sort words. We discussed the process for organizing words based on a word's spelling/letter order (start by comparing words' first letter and then work your way to the right).

#### Writing

This week we wrote about our story, *The Girl Who Thought in Pictures*. We made connections between people, events, and ideas. Specifically, we described Dr. Grandin, her life, and her inventions/ideas as well as scientists in general.

# Theology

This week, we prepared for the Feast of All Saints by learning about this special day. We, also, began preparing for Vocations Week (Nov 3-9) by talking about the role of the laity, deacons, priests, bishops, and the Pope. We read from the book *Dear Pope Francis* and listened as Pope Francis answered questions from children around the world, then read the children's page from the Catholic Virginian newspaper, where Bishop Barry Knestout, also, answers questions from students in the Diocese of Richmond. Finally, we brainstormed questions to submit to Bishop Knestout in the newspaper, so keep yours eyes open for CCS first grade in upcoming editions!

## Science

This week we had some Halloween fun with some STEAM activities. We listened to the book *The Good, The Bad, and the Spooky* and then designed a costume for the bad seed to wear. We also wrote about why we chose this costume for the Bad Seed and what we are or want to be for Halloween. We also did a pumpkin challenge in which we saw how many pumpkins we can decorate in 3 minutes!
