## **Social Studies**

This week in SS, students continued our unit which focuses on Native American history. Students learned about how Native Americans have lived in Virginia for thousands of years and which regions different tribes were.

Next week, we will have our test over this unit. <u>The test is currently scheduled for Tuesday, November 5.</u> We will also start our project on Chapter 2 which is a diorama of a Native American village. We will do the writing portion in class next week. I am sending home information on this project today as well as putting information in Google Classroom. <u>The actual creation of the diorama is to be done at home. The diorama is due on Monday,</u> November 11.

### Math

This week in Math, we practiced estimating products and multiplying by 10, 100, and 1,000. We also had fun reviewing skip counting on the playground to get our brains and bodies moving.

## Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week in LA, students completed their final activity with The Tiger Rising! Students learned how to write a 5 paragraph opinion essay! This was a big challenge and students did very well!

Next week, we will begin our new unit. This unit focuses on nonfiction texts and will culminate with a research project on natural disasters!

# Theology

This week in Theology, we had our lesson on setting boundaries. The student brought up some great examples and times when this could be helpful. We also had a blast going to see second grade's Saint Projects.

Next week we will learn about vocations and begin the research for our Saint Project. This Project will be done completely in class, though students will be able to work on their report at home and practice for their presentations as needed.

## Science

This week on Science, we learned about the water cycle, storms, and how to read a weather map. Students had a blast working together in groups to create a weather map for a real or made up country of their choice.
