Social Studies

In history we will be learning about early US history and how we came to be a nation. We are going to be learning about the first English colonies in North America. We will be starting our research and journal entry writing for our chosen colonial trade. Here are a few important dates: Rough draft due 11/7, Final copy due 11/13, Colonial Trade presentations on 11/13 (in costume, with props, memorization *not* required).

Students will be tested on sections of the United States. Students need to identify each state and write the correct name and its capital. To make this more manageable, students will only be learning one section at a time. The **Pacific Region test** will be on Tuesday, October 29th. **November 19th & 20th** will be the test dates for **all 50 states and capitals**. Students need to identify the correct state by shape/location and be able to write the state and capital name (spelling and capital letters count).

Math

We have started to review long division using the mnemonic "Does McDonalds sell cheese burgers?" Knowing your multiplication facts is a must for success. Please continue to practice multiplication facts at home.

To reinforce math concepts and skills, students are assigned sections for Khan Academy (khanacademy.org). This is for a grade. Students have their login and password in their planner. The 2nd qtr. requirements are to complete *Get ready for multiplication and division with whole numbers and decimals* (unit 4) and *Get ready for powers of 10* (unit 6). Students will work on Khan Academy as part of their extended math time.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week we continued discussing and analyzing *Wonder* and completed five of the six banners for the banner project connected to the novel. The final project will be due on Friday, November 8. We also had a spelling and vocabulary test and continued studying nouns (common/proper and singular/plural). There will be a quiz on nouns next week, and students will receive a new list of spelling words.

Theology

We began the unit on the liturgical calendar and holy days of obligation this week and will continue with that next week. There will be a quiz on the vocabulary associated with this unit next week.

Science

We are learning about ecosystems. We will also be making a conservation project using empty 2 liter bottles. Please send in any empty 2 liter bottles if you can. Please point out to your student any kudzu that is growing along the road if you have the opportunity. This is a great example of an invasive species.

Our next unit will be on atoms and elements. We will be conducting a mystery matter box lab in science.
