Social Studies

We are focused on science this quarter.

Math

We are completing Unit 6 which includes understanding addition. We also continued to practice counting to 100! Some of them already know how to count to 100. At this time, the students are now expected to count to fifty. The students have also been counting to 100 by 5s and 10s. We have calendar time during math every day. The students continue to learn our days of the week song, months of the year song and seasons every day.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

The students are continuing to practice reading to self and work on writing. Please have your child read the books we send home every Friday to you three times to practice sight words and fluency. **Our sight words this week are: he, that, on, was, she. Next week's word are: they, but, at, with, all.**

Theology

Our kindergarteners learned about praying. They learned we can pray silently or out loud. Our students also learned how to pray and that you can pray anywhere because God is always listening! We learned about Saint Clare as well.

Science

We conducted our first experiments and the students really enjoyed it! Since it was Halloween yesterday, we had pumpkins carved by Mrs. Zartler and used baking

soda, vinegar, food dye and beads. Our kindergarteners enjoyed watching the explosion out of the pumpkins' mouths.
