Social Studies

This week students will explore the continent of Africa and will be introduced to the unique geographic features. Students will learn about the Nile River and the ancient cultures.

Next week students will learn about the Sahara Desert and the Andes Mountains then draw/ label both geographic features on their map of Africa. Students will begin a vocabulary foldable booklet.

This Week:

We began learning how to craft a paragraph (5 sentences) about a familiar topic (Halloween). We followed the writing process which included Prewriting (Graphic Organizers such as a Bubble Map and Hamburger Outline), Writing a Rough Draft, Revising/Editing (Color Editing Strategy and other Checklists), and Publishing a Final Draft. Students also received their Writing Project Packet on Thursday, so please check their Blue Folders.

Theology

This Week:

Through discussions and activities within our Christ In Us workbook, we learned that the Church is more than just a building, but rather, it's made of people (e.g., priests, altar servers, the assembly of worshipers, all those who are baptized, and those who have died and are living in heaven). Furthermore, Saint Paul explained that the Church is the body of Christ on earth and that all the parts of the body are important and are connected to one another. Additionally, we celebrated Vocations Awareness Week and learned about the different ways in which God may call us to love and serve him in our lives. We also wrote letters of support to a current seminarian in Virginia and prayed for him and others who may be called to the vocation of priesthood.

Next Week:

Even though we are into November and finished with our school-wide Rosary, we will continue discussing and learning about the Rosary. This will include Rosary related activities and practicing prayers such as Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be, as well as introducing prayers such as the Fatima Prayer, Apostles Creed, and the Hail Holy Queen. We will also be preparing/reviewing for our Unit 1 Test in our Christ In Us workbook (Lessons 1-5). This will largely come down to vocabulary, so it is suggested that the focus of studying be paid to the Faith Words from each of these lessons.

Science
