Math

Patterns, patterns, everywhere! The Sloths and Cheetahs applied their skip counting knowledge to problem solving, repeated addition, and arrays. In addition to numbers, our pattern pioneers also worked with shapes and objects to identify, extend, and create number patterns. Many of our mathematicians enjoy using counters, hundred charts, and drawings to solve story problems, and are learning to show their mathematical thinking in pictures, numbers, and words.

And...they're off! Week two of timed daily math fact practice is underway. To support your marvelous mathematician, please practice math facts at home daily.

Literacy

The Cheetahs and Sloths began novel studies this week! After a non-fiction heavy first quarter, they are excited to dive into fiction! We're building fluency, practicing reading with intonation and expression (reading like actors!), segmenting words (isolating syllables and prefix/suffixes) to decode unfamiliar words, and asking questions to support deep understanding.

Religion

Happy Vocations Awareness week! This week, the Cheetahs and Sloths learned how God has called us all to a unique Vocation... the way that he is calling us to love and serve Him and others throughout our lives. We explored the 4 Vocations – Marriage, Priesthood, Religious Life, and Single Life, and identified how each of these ways allow us to love and serve.

On Tuesday, during our chapel visit, the children got to see and hear about priestly vestments – alb, cinture, stole, and chasuble – and learned why they are different colors... because of the different liturgical seasons!

On Wednesday, after taking the 7 Sacraments Quiz, we then learned about our "adopted" seminarian, Matt Kelly, who is studying within our diocese to become a priest. We added him to our list of intentions, along with an increase in Vocations, and wrote him wonderful encouraging cards!

Next week, we will begin to take a closer look at the Sacrament of Reconciliation as the time for those who are receiving this year draws near!

Science/Social Studies

What a perfect week to kick off a unit about traditions that honor and foster patriotism in the United States of America, as well as the responsibilities of a good citizen!
