Science

This week students will continue with their seed experiment. They will compare and contrast how animals and plants grow and change over time. They will also learn about incomplete metamorphosis and compare it to the complete metamorphosis of a butterfly and a frog.

Next week students will review what plants need to live and the functions of each part. They will learn the process of photosynthesis and be introduced to deciduous trees and evergreen trees.

• I will be sending home students diagrams on plant and animal cells in their Friday Folders, please have students use the diagram as a study guide.

Social Studies

This week students will explore the continent of Asia and be introduced to three geographic features; The Huang He Delta, The Himalayas, The Gobi Desert. They will complete a map of the continent and add it to their passport project.

Next week students will explore the continent of Europe and learn about the Mediterranean Sea, the Alps, and the Italian Peninsula. They will complete a map identifying the three geographic features and add it to their passport project.

Math

This week students will be introduced to the addition properties; commutative, associative, and identity to assist in adding numbers. They will continue to work on counting money and making change.

Next week students will learn about addition patterns using an addition table and strategies for adding mentally. They will continue to work on counting money and making change.

This Week:

- -Suffixes: able/ible (can be done), as well as ion, er, est, ly, ing, e/es, ed, un, and re

- -Daily Grammar Review: Focus: Simple and Compound Sentences and FANBOYS (Coordinating Conjunctions For, **And**, Nor, **But**, **Or**, **So**
- -Word Study: Vowel Team Review (all long vowels sounds) and Affix: able/ible
- -Writing: Sentence Structure (Simple and Compound Sentences)
 - -We will continue writing summaries by using the Somebody Wanted But So Then strategy, as well as other organizational strategies/graphic organizers to support writing.

With the help of the books *Cactus Soup* and *Stone Soup*, we began looking at the skill of comparing and contrasting. We also explored how identifying that text structure within a reading passage can help with comprehension.
