# Social Studies

# Math

This week we have started a new unit on subtraction. We have just begun to learn about subtraction strategies in problems to 10. We have learned about how to use a number line, how to count down, and how to use a number bond to help us. We have also started learning that we can use addition facts to help us check our subtraction number sentences. Next week we will continue to learn about subtraction.

#### <u>Reading</u>

This week we used our short week to complete any work that may have gone unfinished from weeks past. We also spent some time reviewing past comprehension skills and listened to some books on gratitude.

#### <u>Grammar</u>

This week we spent time reviewing past grammar skills.

This week we used what we learned about gratitude and spent some time writing about what we were thankful for. We then wrote our sentences on turkey feathers which have been placed on a large turkey in our hallway.
