Social Studies

This week we completed our lapbook on Veterans Day and Election Day. We talked about the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in preparation for our time in the STEM lab making parade floats. We also completed a Thanksgiving STEM challenge in the classroom in which we used 20 popsicle sticks and 24 dominos to make a table to fit a Thanksgiving dinner.

Math

This week we began our unit on subtraction within 10. We learned how to write subtraction number sentences and how to subtract by counting backwards, using number bonds, and number lines to 10.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Reading

This week we prepared for Thanksgiving by reading *A Plump and Perky Turkey* by Teresa Bateman. We reviewed how strong readers ask questions to make connections, to check for understanding, to make predictions, and to figure out unknown words.

Grammar

This week we reviewed adjectives and practiced using them and identifying them in sentences.

Writing

This week we practiced our writing with a focus on retelling stories in the correct sequence, including a beginning, middle and end.

Theology

In Theology, we continued learning about vocations. Students are bringing home a paper titled *Interview with an Adult* that they can complete over break. They will be asking you some questions about your vocation and writing your responses as a way to find out more about how adults can make a loving gift of themselves to their families through their work, and that sometimes entails doing things they like and sometimes entails doing things they do not like. We, also, talked about how Thanksgiving is a holiday where we give thanks to God since all good things come from Him. Next week, we will be preparing for the season of Advent!

Science

We focused on social studies this week.

Please make sure that your child brings something warm and long sleeve to school each day (e.g., jacket, sweatshirt, sweater). We will continue to go outside, weather permitting, for recess, lunch, and snack as much as we can.

Girls must also be in navy knee highs, navy leggings, or navy tights. 
Cold, Flu, RSV, Strep and COVID season is upon us. One of the best ways to prevent illness and its spread, is good hand washing. When soap and water aren't available, alcohol based hand sanitizer can do the trick. Remember to thoroughly rub all hand/finger surfaces and to scrub for 20 seconds. Sing a happy tune as you go! Cough and sneeze into your elbow and when possible avoid crowded places and spending time with those who are sick or having symptoms. See the links for more information.

CCS illness policy abides by the Virginia Department of Health (VDOH) guidelines which requires students to remain home until **FEVER FREE** for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing agents. Fever Free is a temperature of less than 100.1°F. Also, gastrointestinal (GI) issues such as vomit and diarrhea, must remain home until 24 hours free of symptoms. **After any illness, students should not return to school unless they can successfully make it through the day. Reminder! No medications**

including cough drops will be dispensed without a licensed medical provider's order.

CCS will notify families of any infectious outbreaks that occur within the school setting. Per the VDOH, an outbreak is the occurrence of more cases of disease than expected. There is no strict definition of an outbreak or specific number of cases that need to occur to be considered an outbreak.



Colder Weather means Warmer Clothes

Please remember that upon our return from Thanksgiving break, winter dress is in place. Children also need to be sent with appropriate weather clothing. This could mean gloves, hats, coats/jackets, etc. As more items are worn into school, less items may make it home. Please write your child's name in any items you wish not to lose.
