Language Arts/Reading/Writing

The Hawks are devouring fiction chapter books! We're practicing a variety of skills to enhance expression, intonation, fluency, comprehension, and retelling. Each group is identifying the setting, getting to know characters, and describing the plot, all while being introduced to fabulous authors, "fan favorite" books, and/or books that are part of a series that will leave your Hawk wanting more. It is absolutely thrilling to see them light up as readers.

Building Community! As writers, the Hawks are learning to use our classroom writing community to boost their writing skills by advising one another on idea generation, offering constructive criticism, and listening to each other's pieces. The Hawks also spend time weekly reflecting on their strengths as writers, while also setting goals for improvement.


Cold, Flu, RSV, Strep and COVID season is upon us. One of the best ways to prevent illness and its spread, is good hand washing. When soap and water aren't available, alcohol based hand sanitizer can do the trick. Remember to thoroughly rub all hand/finger surfaces and to scrub for 20 seconds. Sing a happy tune as you go! Cough and sneeze into your elbow and when possible avoid crowded places and spending time with those who are sick or having symptoms. See the links for more information.

CCS illness policy abides by the Virginia Department of Health (VDOH) guidelines which requires students to remain home until **FEVER FREE** for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing agents. Fever Free is a temperature of less than 100.1°F. Also, gastrointestinal (GI) issues such as vomit and diarrhea, must remain home until 24 hours free of symptoms. **After any illness, students should not return to school unless they can successfully make it through the day. Reminder! No medications**

including cough drops will be dispensed without a licensed medical provider's order.

CCS will notify families of any infectious outbreaks that occur within the school setting. Per the VDOH, an outbreak is the occurrence of more cases of disease than expected. There is no strict definition of an outbreak or specific number of cases that need to occur to be considered an outbreak.



Colder Weather means Warmer Clothes

Please remember that upon our return from Thanksgiving break, winter dress is in place. Children also need to be sent with appropriate weather clothing. This could mean gloves, hats, coats/jackets, etc. As more items are worn into school, less items may make it home. Please write your child's name in any items you wish not to lose.
