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Social Studies

This week in SS, students completed and presented their Native American diorama projects! This was a fantastic opportunity to learn about Native American history and culture. Thank you for helping your child gather the materials needed to complete this project. It was a huge success!

When we return from Thanksgiving Break, we will begin to learn about Jamestown.

Science

This week in Science the kids continued to learn about physical and behavioral adaptations. They have enjoyed working on their Adaptation projects, and look forward to sharing these when we return from Thanksgiving break. When we return we will continue Chapter 3, and learn about extinction, fossils, and the ways species have evolved over time.

Math

This week in Math we have been focused on multiplication strategies involving partial products, area models, and the distributive property. We incorporated these skills into multi-step word problems with other operations. We took our Unit 6 test today. When we return from Thanksgiving break, we will begin Unit 7 and learn division strategies for multi-digit numbers. **Please ensure your child continues to work on multiplication facts 0-12 at home.**

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week in LA, students continued a new unit in which we are focusing on nonfiction texts. Students are learning how to properly read nonfiction texts, take notes, identify text structures, and get the most out of these informational books. It will culminate in a research project on natural disasters that will begin upon returning from Thanksgiving Break.

Theology

This week in Theology we have been learning about the Joyful mysteries of the Rosary, we continued writing an encouraging letter to our class seminarian, and have been focused on ways we praise and thank God in Unit 2 Lesson 7. We've related aspects of our own gatherings and celebrations for seasons and holidays, to those that we celebrate as a Church throughout our liturgical year. When we return from Thanksgiving break, we will begin Unit 2 Lesson 8: "How do we become members of the Church?"


Cold, Flu, RSV, Strep and COVID season is upon us. One of the best ways to prevent illness and its spread, is good hand washing. When soap and water aren't available, alcohol based hand sanitizer can do the trick. Remember to thoroughly rub all hand/finger surfaces and to scrub for 20 seconds. Sing a happy tune as you go! Cough and sneeze into your elbow and when possible avoid crowded places and spending time with those who are sick or having symptoms. See the links for more information.

CCS illness policy abides by the Virginia Department of Health (VDOH) guidelines which requires students to remain home until **FEVER FREE** for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing agents. Fever Free is a temperature of less than 100.1°F. Also, gastrointestinal (GI) issues such as vomit and diarrhea, must remain home until 24 hours free of symptoms. After any illness, students should not return to school unless they can successfully make it through the day. Reminder! No medications

including cough drops will be dispensed without a licensed medical provider's order.

CCS will notify families of any infectious outbreaks that occur within the school setting. Per the VDOH, an outbreak is the occurrence of more cases of disease than expected. There is no strict definition of an outbreak or specific number of cases that need to occur to be considered an outbreak.



Colder Weather means Warmer Clothes

Please remember that upon our return from Thanksgiving break, winter dress is in place. Children also need to be sent with appropriate weather clothing. This could mean gloves, hats, coats/jackets, etc. As more items are worn into school, less items may make it home. Please write your child's name in any items you wish not to lose.
