Teacher's Message/Announcements

• December 5-9: St. Nick's Shop

The Cville Catholic School St. Nick's shop is a chance for students in JK-5th grade to shop for some small holiday gifts for family members. The shop will offer items ranging from \$2-\$15 that students can choose to purchase for family members (sibling gifts are available in the lower dollar range and some of the parent gifts are in the upper range). The week before the event, a form will be sent home for parents to complete listing the names of each gift recipient and dollar amount range that each student can spend per person on the list. Participation is optional. Parents can elect to donate any unspent funds to the school, or request change.

Each class will have a designated shopping day/time. A few students at a time will go in to shop (the rest of the class will watch a Christmas movie while waiting). Once inside, each shopper will walk around with a volunteer parent shopper to help them choose gifts within their shopping budget. Gifts will be wrapped by a separate set of parents.

Math

*We will be working on mastering our multiplication table 0-12 and doubles by the end of the 2nd quarter (this is an extension). Please practice the basic multiplication facts at home or in the car coming to and from school. Knowing your multiplication facts is a vital skill that students will be needing for success in math in school and in daily life.

*Students will need to complete (mastery level) Khan Academy *Add Decimals and Subtract Decimals* by the end of the 2nd quarter.

This week we worked on long division with and without remainders. We will continue to work on long division and problem solving involving division.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week we continued reading and annotating *Wonder* and took a quiz on homophones. ,We also began a study of collective nouns, and we will conclude that with a quiz after the break. We also will finish reading *Wonder* the week after the Thanksgiving break.

There are two IRAs for the second quarter (one must be historical fiction and the other is "free choice"), and the two digital forms for them are on Google Classroom/Reading. They will both be due on Friday, January 6. Since next Tuesday is the mid-way point of the quarter, students should have (or be close to having) one IRA completed.

Religion

This week students took a quiz on the Holy Days of Obligation. We also began a unit on the liturgical calendar, and that will continue after the break as well.

Science

This week we started our new unit on Matter. We will be learning about the states of matter, atoms and the periodic table. Students will be participating in several matter labs this week.
