## Math

The Praying Puppies and The Holly Jollies concluded the unit on Addition with Regrouping. Please check folders for graded tests today!

Following this big achievement, our super second graders had the chance to browse recipes, "shop" from a Thanksgiving catalogue (decorations, tableware, dinner, and dessert), and create a grocery list to plan the perfect (pretend) classroom Thanksgiving celebration, all while staying within a pre-set budget and making sure they prepared enough food for the whole class. Our cuties worked in collaborative groups and learned a lot about delegating responsibility, taking turns, and listening.

Next week, our focus will be strengthening math fact fluency/fact families to best support our second graders for a unit on Subtraction with and without Regrouping.

### Literacy (Reading / Writing / Spelling)

The Praying Puppies and The Holly Jollies spent this week reading non-fiction texts. Key features of non-fiction texts, reading aloud with expression, and comprehension skills were emphasized.

As authors, our second graders showcased their ability to create acrostic poems, use Venn diagrams to compare and contrast, and write persuasive arguments, all with a Thanksgiving lens.

Students also completed additional assessments in spelling, writing, and fluency. When we return from Thanksgiving Break, students will receive small-group targeted instruction in both reading and spelling.

#### Science / Social Studies

Silly Science was a hit! Thank you to the many families who donated supplies...we are so thankful for your generosity!!!! Ask your child about the <u>Candy Catapult</u>, the <u>Turkey Egg Drop</u>, the <u>Dancing Popcorn</u>, and the <u>Puking Pumpkin</u>. Each experiment is linked in case you'd like to try them at home!

Following Thanksgiving Break, The Praying Puppies and The Holly Jollies will kick off a new unit focused on Native Americans. Our sensational second graders will be learning all about the Powhatan, Lakota, and Pueblo tribes. We have several hands-on activities planned and would love your help! *Please send in the following items with your child by Tuesday, November 30:* 

- 1 box (shoebox or similarly sized)
- 1 grocery bag or gallon ziplock bag of natural materials collected from outside (leaves, moss, sticks, acorns, rocks, etc...the sky's the limit!)

The Praying Puppies and The Holly Jollies be using these natural materials to design villages for each tribe to showcase all that they have learned.
