Social Studies

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Reading

This week we prepared for Thanksgiving by reading *A Plump and Perky Turkey* by Teresa Bateman. We reviewed how strong readers ask questions to make connections, to check for understanding, to make predictions, and to figure out unknown words.

<u>Grammar</u>

This week we reviewed adjectives and practiced using them and identifying them in sentences.

Writing

This week we practiced our writing with a focus on retelling stories in the correct sequence, including a beginning, middle and end.

Theology

This week, we learned about the season of Advent and prepared by decorating ornaments for our Jesse Tree, which will reside in the hallway between the first grade classrooms during Advent. As we read about salvation history from accounts in the Bible throughout the season, students will hang up the corresponding ornaments.

Science
