Math

Ms. Wawner's class learned about ABC patterns this week. Students had fun making their own AB and ABC patterns with dot paints, foam shapes, and legos. They designed their own patterned socks and t-shirts. Ms. Shank's class finished our unit on patterns. Upon our return from break we will begin working on graphing.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Ms. Wawner's class focused on the letter M this week and the sight word "see." While students are learning their letters and sounds to be able to decode words, they are practicing sight words that don't follow regular phonological rules, so they can identify them in texts. We also read books that featured the letter M, specifically the "If You Give a Mouse a Cookie" series. Ms. Shank's class reviewed letters and sounds for letters A-E and completed an assessment. We also read "Bear Snores On" and created a sequencing hat about our story. When we return we will study the letter I. Our author study will be Jan Brett who wrote "The Hat" and "The Mitten".

Theology/SEL

Ms. Wawner's class focused on gratitude this week. We talked about how you can appreciate small and large natural wonders, family and friends, and everyday happenings. Students looked at picture scenarios and brainstormed things they could be grateful for in that scenario. We also made a gratitude book. We will start learning about Advent the week after Thanksgiving break. Ms. Shank's class talked about the meaning of a Jesse Tree and began creating ours to start putting up when we return. We talked about Advent and the Advent wreath.

Science/Social Studies

Ms. Wawner's class investigated wild turkeys this week! We found that turkeys are birds that can fly, swim, and run very fast. We created a turkey facts poster and book that students are able to take home. We also created turkeys through process art-first learning how to draw a turkey with oil pastels and then coloring them with watercolors. Be sure to ask your student about other wild turkey facts they know. Ms. Shank's class began looking at hibernation, why animals hibernate, what animals hibernate. Each student made their own bear cave craft. When we return we will talk about migration.
