Social Studies

This week we started our lapbook that will focus on Election Day and Veterans Day. We held a class election in which we listened to the books "Duck for President" as well as "Grace for President". We then made campaign posters for the candidate we wanted to vote for. We worked on casting our ballot and then counted the votes and graphed them.

Math

This week we continued adding within 20. We explored doubles as well as doubles +1 and doubles +2. We also learned how to make 10 in order to solve and addition number sentence. On Halloween we worked on a math Halloween escape room which explored topics that we have learned so far this year as well as some challenges that we will be learning about this year. The spooky characters in our escape room either left a trick like pumpkin guts, ghost poop, and a zombie hand (just to name a few) or they brought us treats which we brought home with us. Next week we will finish up addition within 20.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Reading

Through our main story of the week, *Maddi's Fridge*, as well as supplemental readings, we made valuable connections (text to text and text to world) and explored ideas of friendship and charity. We also examined how to read a website while discussing internet safety. Next week we will read the story, *Plump and Perky Turkey*, and focus on asking questions as readers and summarizing skills (Beginning, Middle, and End).

<u>Grammar</u>

This week's focus was on common nouns vs. proper nouns. We addressed the need for proper nouns (specific names of people, places, and brands) to be capitalized and compared nouns like school and Charlottesville Catholic School. Next week we will target adjectives and use them to describe characters from our stories and people and things in our writing.

Writing

This week we included proper nouns into our writing as we wrote about friendship and ways to help one another. We also wrote within Daily 5 activity rotations and in other content areas such as Social Studies (Veterans Day), Religion (Giving Thanks), and morning work tasks. Next week we will be working on summaries as well as focusing on adjectives to help describe/bring color to our writing.

Theology

In Theology this week, we discussed the importance of being generous with others. We read about Jesus' greatest and 2nd greatest commandments from the gospel of Matthew and learned that we are required, as Christians, to be charitable with our neighbors both in words and actions. We, also, learned about the virtue of advocacy and how St. Teresa of Avila exemplified this virtue by helping her fellow sisters grow in their own relationships with God.

Science

We focused on social studies this week.
