### This Week:

We were in the Halloween spirit this week with some "scary" campfire stories and with our read aloud, *Picnic at Mudsock Meadow*, where we focused on the climax of the story and asked good

questions before, during, and after. We also continued reviewing verbs, while identifying adjectives and using comparative adjectives (-er, -est).

### **Next Week:**
