Social Studies

In history we will be learning about early US history and how we came to be a nation. We will have a test on the states and capitals for the Pacific. region of the US. on 11/14

We are continuing research for our colonial trade project.

A few important dates:

Students in 5th grade will be tested on all US states and their capitals. The states will be chunked by region for learning and mastery. A great way to study the states is found on a free game learning website:

Math

This week we focused on division of whole numbers and decimals. We use the mnemonic, "Does McDonalds sell cheese burgers?" to help students include all the steps in long division.

To reinforce math concepts and skills, students are assigned sections for Khan Academy (khanacademy.org). This is for a grade. Students have their login and password in their planner. The 2nd qtr. requirements, due before the end of the quarter are Multiplying & dividing whole numbers and decimals (unit 4) and Adding and subtracting fractions (unit 3).

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week we continued reading *Wonder* and continued focusing on characterization. We continued working on the banner project associated with the book, and that project will continue through the rest of the time we are working on the novel. In the end, students will have created a total of six banners in which they are identifying character traits and providing supporting evidence for those traits. We also had a quiz on identifying points of view in literature. Students also worked with the new list of spelling words (high-frequency words). We also began studying possessive nouns.

Next week we will continue reading and annotating *Wonder*, and we will continue to work on the banner project. Students will also have quizzes on the high-frequency spelling words and on possessive nouns.

Theology

This week we had a quiz on lessons 1 and 2 in the *Christ in Us* testbook. Next week we will start a unit on the Holy Days of Obligation.

Science

We have been learning about ecosystems. We will learn about invasive species and their impact on the environment.
